Testimony in SUPPORT of HB 462, Relating to the State Librarian's Salary

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony. The Board of Education SUPPORTS HB 462.

The current salary cap, for the State Librarian has not seen an adjustment for fourteen years, if adjusted for meeting the cost of living the present value would be \$164,000. The current salary is well below national norms.

The proposed increase of the salary cap from \$150,000 to \$200,000 is based upon a comprehensive review of similar positions and responsibilities in other States.

Any future salary adjustments would be dependent on a rigorous performance evaluation.
