HB 463 – Relating to Libraries

The Hawaii State Public Library System has requested and strongly supports HB 463.

The purpose of this bill is to update Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statues (HRS) so it accurately reflects long-standing State of Hawaii Board of Education (BOE) and Hawaii State Public Library System (HSPLS) practice.

Chapter 312, HRS, assigns various duties and responsibilities to the BOE. In practice, the board does not, and has never carried out these duties and responsibilities. The State Librarian is the one who actually executes these operational duties for the HSPLS. This bill will amend Chapter 312, HRS, so that it more accurately reflects the duties and responsibilities of the BOE, HSPLS and the State Librarian.

The proposed revision to the HRS corrects and more accurately reflects the duties of the State Librarian.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on HB 463 and your continued support of the Hawaii State Public Library System.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIBRARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes, sets forth
2	the duties and responsibilities of the state board of education.
3	This Act makes housekeeping changes that will more accurately
4	reflect long-standing board of education and Hawaii state public
5	library system practice. These duties and responsibilities,
6	which were initially assigned to the board of education, have
7	been delegated to the state librarian and the Hawaii state public
8	library system for many decades.
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
10	[by adding a new section] to be appropriately designated and to
11	read as follows:
12	<u>"\$312State librarian; appointment; duties.</u> The state
13	librarian shall collect, purchase, receive gifts of, and
14	otherwise acquire all books and other publications proper for
15	libraries, and arrange, classify, and catalog the same; provide
16	for their safekeeping; expend moneys appropriated by the
17	legislature and otherwise acquired for the development, use,
18	support, and maintenance of libraries; provide ways and means for

19 placing libraries within reach of all residents throughout the

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1 State and particularly of all public and private school children; 2 provide and maintain branch libraries, offices, or places for the distribution of books and periodicals throughout the State; enter 3 4 into contracts as may be necessary to carry into effect the 5 general duties herein imposed; appoint such officers and 6 employees as deemed necessary, all of whom shall be under the authority of the governor for purposes of chapters 76, 78, 89, 7 8 and 89C; and adopt rules for the management and use of libraries, 9 and for the control of the property under its management." **§312-2.1** Appointment of state librarian; duties; salary. (a) 10 11 The state librarian shall be appointed by the board of 12 education, without regard to chapter 76, shall be under the 13 direction of the board, shall be responsible for the operation, planning, programming, and budgeting of all community/school and 14 public libraries within the State, and may be removed by a 15 16 majority vote of its members. The state librarian may be 17 appointed: (1) Without regard to the state residency provisions of 18 section 78-1(b); and 19 (2) For a term of up to four years. 20 (b) The salary of the state librarian shall be set by the 21 22 board of education at a rate no greater than \$120,000 a year.



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SECTION 3. Section 312-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

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"§312-1 Duties of the board of education. The board of 3 education shall care for, manage, and control all property set 4 apart, donated, loaned to, or in any manner acquired for the use 5 of libraries; receive, care for, expend, and account for any 6 money which may be received for the purpose of erecting buildings 7 for libraries or for any other purposes of the libraries [;-8 9 collect, purchase, receive gifts of, and otherwise acquire all books and other publications proper for libraries, and arrange, 10 11 classify, and catalogue the same; provide for their safekeeping; 12 expend moneys appropriated by the legislature and otherwise 13 acquired for the development, use, support, and maintenance of libraries; provide ways and means for placing libraries within 14 15 reach of all residents throughout the State and particularly of 16 all public and private school children; provide and maintain 17 branch libraries, offices, or places for the distribution of books and periodicals throughout the State; make such contracts 18 as may be necessary to carry into effect the general duties 19 20 herein imposed; appoint such officers and employees as it deems 21 necessary; and make rules for the management and use of 22 libraries, and for the control of the property under its 23 management]."

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1 SECTION 4. Section 312-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 2 "§312-2 Powers of board; special fund. The board of 3 4 education may: 5 (1) Except as provided in section 312-3.9, make arrangements or contracts as are approved by the 6 7 governor, with any county, city, association, society, person, or persons, for the purpose of benefiting the 8 9 libraries and increasing their facilities and use; Subject to section 26-12, enter into such arrangement 10 (2) 11 or contract as is approved by the governor, with the Friends of the Library of Hawaii, for the purpose of 12 obtaining the use of books and property and income of 13 14 the Friends of the Library of Hawaii; Cooperate by exchange and otherwise with libraries now 15 (3) existing or hereafter to be formed; 16 17 (4) Receive, use, manage, or invest moneys or other 18 property, real, personal, or mixed which may be given, 19 bequeathed, devised, or in any manner received from 20 sources other than the legislature or any federal appropriation for any or all purposes of the libraries; 21 Deposit with the director of finance in a special fund 22 (5) 23 all moneys donated to the board for library services;

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1 (6) Unless otherwise provided for by the terms and conditions of the donation, convert, at such time as 2 the board may at its sole discretion determine, any or 3 all donations of property, real, personal, or mixed, 4 5 into money to be deposited into the special fund; and (7) Expend the moneys in the special fund in accordance 6 7 with the terms and conditions of each donation for the purposes of the libraries. 8

9 The board shall be the trustee of the special fund and all moneys 10 therein shall be deemed to have been appropriated to the use and for the purposes of the [board] Hawaii state public library 11 system in providing library services. Nothing in this section 12 13 shall be construed to limit the powers and duties of the board 14 hereinbefore expressed, or to empower the board to obligate the 15 State financially in any sum which shall not have been appropriated by the legislature for the use of the board." 16 17 SECTION 5. Section 312-4.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 19 "(a) The [board of education] state librarian may charge 20 and add a fee to any amount due in accordance with [its] the 21 state librarian's duties and powers under section [312-1] 312-22 for:

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Any cost or expense incurred by the Hawaii state public 1 (1) 2 library system as a result of any action taken to enforce the collection of costs of lost books and any 3 overdue fines and fees charged to that patron after the 4 5 public library system has mailed written notice demanding payment and advising that continued failure 6 7 to pay the amount due may result in collection action being taken, including the imposition of cost-recovery 8 9 fees, not to exceed \$10, pursuant to this section. Any 10 cost-recovery fee charged against the patron for costs, fees, and other charges may include collection agency 11 12 fees, attorneys' fees, court filing fees, and similar 13 fees incurred by the Hawaii state public library system 14 in connection with the collection action; 15 (2) Hawaii public library system sponsored seminars or 16 workshops, including educational materials in various 17 media format; and 18 (3) Research and reference materials published on magnetic 19 media, CD-ROM, or other [machine-readable] digital or electronic form." 20 21 SECTION 6. Section 312-4.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows: 22

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1	"(d)	The [board of education] state librarian shall

4	(2)	The waiver of fees;
5	(3)	The documents, materials, and services for which fees

11	(6)	The period of time that the lost library materials
12		costs, fines, or fees must remain unpaid before they
13		may be referred to a collection agency for collection
14		pursuant to rules adopted under chapter 91; and
15	(7)	The notification of persons with delinquent accounts of
16		the additional fees to be charged by the collection
17		agency prior to the referral to the collection agency."
18	SECT	ION 7. Section 312-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended to	o read as follows:
20	"§ 31 2	2-5 Annual report to the governor. Annually during the
21	month of .	July but as of June 30 preceding, the [board of
22	education] <u>state librarian</u> shall report to the governor the
23	moneys rea	ceived from all sources and expended for all purposes

1 during the preceding year, and any other matters pertaining to 2 the libraries which it may deem important, or the governor may require." 3 4 SECTION 8. Section 312-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) as follows: 5 6 "(a) The [board of education, through the] state librarian $[-\tau]$ shall: 7 8 (1) Provide for the establishment and ongoing operation of 9 a fee for enhanced service program, which includes but is not limited to the planning, programming, and 10 budgeting of operating, research and development, and 11 12 capital investment programs; and (2) Administer a special fund to be known as the "library 13 14 fee for enhanced services special fund"." SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 16 17 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
