In consideration of **HOUSE BILL 527, HOUSE DRAFT 1** MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR STATE LIFEGUARDS

House Bill 527, House Draft 1 proposes to promote public safety by appropriating funds to provide lifeguard services at Kua Bay, Kekaha Kai State Park on the Island of Hawaii. The Department of Land and Natural Resources supports this measure provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact the Department's priorities indicated in the Executive Biennium Budget request.

The State does not have its own lifeguards, and contracts with the counties for those services at selected State Parks beaches. Currently each county provides lifeguards at one State Park beach. On the Island of Hawaii, there are lifeguards at Hapuna Beach.
