SUBJECT: H.B. 600 HD1 - RELATING TO COMMUNITY CARE FOSTER FAMILY HOMES

Hearing: Wednesday, March 4, 2015; 11:00 a.m. Conference Room 308, State Capitol

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this bill is to authorize the Department of Health to allow two private pay individuals to be cared for in the same community care foster

family home if certain requirements are met.

<u>DEPARTMENT'S POSITION</u>: The Department of Human Services (DHS)

appreciates the intent of this measure and provides comments on this bill. The DHS supports the availability of community-based resources for residents but remains concerned that a possible unintended consequence is that the proposed changes may displace or reduce the availability of community care foster homes for Medicaid recipients.

The Community Care Foster Family home (CCFFH) was created under the former Medicaid waiver program of the same name. The foster family home was, and still is, an integral part of the long term care continuum of care and provides a less restrictive community-based home for Medicaid recipients at a nursing facility level of care. The CCFFH allows recipients to remain in the community rather than go into a nursing home. Currently CCFFHs are licensed for two residents and may request for a third bed. In order to obtain the third bed, it must be for a Medicaid recipient. This bill would remove that requirement and allow two private pay residents and only one Medicaid recipient under certain conditions.

While DHS recognizes the need for the CCFFH operator to be able to have sufficient income and the desire to keep individuals such as spouses together, the DHS must ensure the availability of CCFFHs for all Medicaid recipients who do not have the means to privately pay for housing. If the intent is to allow a CCFFH to increase the number of residents in their home, a current option available to them, that does not require legislation, would be to seek licensure as an E-ARCH.

I strongly support HB600 because this is another version of SB190 in 2009 that sunset in 2011. In 2009 I had a patient named Sidney Kaide, who was a private-pay. After five years his wife Terry Kaide had a back surgery so she could not take care herself anymore. At this point she wanted to join her husband in my care home but, she was also a private pay. Therefore she was not allowed because we, the Adult Foster Home can only have one private pay. When SB190 in was introduced in 2009 the family worked hard to help pass the bill. The hardships that they went through was physically and emotionally draining. Terry Kaide in a wheelchair flew from Hilo to the State Capitol whenever there was a hearing. When Terry came to visit her husband from another Adult Foster Home she always say to her husband (bed bound) holding his hands, "we worked so hard for our savings thinking that when we get old we have money to support ourselves.... and now we are being punished by the law for being able to pay for our care. We are not asking for money at this point just to be together for the last days of our lives. Sixty three years we are together,its hard for me to understand why there is such a law that separate us when we get old. " In April 2009 Governor Lingle SB190 signed into law and she said "It ends an injustice for one family and it brings hope to families who may find themselves in a similar situation. It is about real people and their lives together"... While the governor was signing the bill Terry Kaide watched from her wheel chair and said, "I'm so happy. I feel great so now we don't have to get permission to live together. We are free." This SB190 after signing into law sunset in two years. The promises were gone! In closing I sincerely ask to support the intent of HB600 that will give equality and justice for elderly, like the Kaides once enjoyed. Thank you very much for giving me the opportunity to testify. We strongly support HB600, which allows for two private-pay clients in a Community Care Foster Family Home (foster homes) where the two private-pay clients are in a special relationship with each other such as a married couple, reciprocal beneficiaries, or siblings. At a recent meeting of AFHA, an organization of over 700 foster homes we collected many signatures, which I have attached, indicating support for this measure.

Indeed, the heart of the foster home program is the family. We take disadvantaged individuals into our home and make them a part of our family. A sense of being part of a family is vital to any human being. Although we count our clients as part of our own family living in the home where we live, some clients would do even better if they could bring their own family into the home.

Clients who are separated from their own family often suffer severe trauma and depression. Outcomes would improve if they were able to live with their own family members like their spouse. Imagine being in a loving marriage or relationship for 50 years and then suddenly being separated. We want to admit clients who will fit well with our clients for their own well-being.

Medicaid clients will continue to have a place in our homes and will continue to be first priority. The foster home program, along with the other long-term care programs, have sufficient space for Medicaid clients, but the inflexible rule of having only one private-pay client is often detrimental to non-Medicaid clients.

Private-pay clients need care just as everyone else. They should have a right to remain in our home if it is their free choice and the choice of their family. They deserve to be treated with dignity and have their choices respected.

For these reasons, we strongly support HB 600.

2 with comments.

3 The intent of this bill is to allow two clients in a relationship to live in the same

4 community care foster family home (CCFFH) when both clients are private pay.

5 The CCFFH program was specifically designed and established to save the state money

6 while ensuring quality health care in an approved setting. Instead of paying for Medicaid

7 recipients to receive nursing facility level health care in an institution such as a skilled nursing

8 facility, they could receive care in a home-like setting at lower costs to the state. As a result, this

9 program was primarily established with Medicaid nursing level of care recipients in mind.

10 DOH's licensure programs are intended to ensure patient safety and quality of care. In

addition to clinical quality of care, life safety, and physical plant requirements among other

12 things, licensees must demonstrate the business and financial ability to operate a home regardless

13 of their specific sources of revenue. Licensure does not require or otherwise consider the

14 licensees' specific sources of revenues. Licensees establish their own fee schedules without

15 DOH scrutiny or regulation and they contract with payors as they wish.

1	This bill changes that and could establish a precedent for DOH's other licensure
2	programs. This bill will authorize DOH to consider specific sources of revenue for the care
3	home operator other than what was originally intended as part of the overall licensure process.
4	Nevertheless, the intent of this bill is to allow nursing level of care couples in an
5	objectively verifiable relationship to live their latter days together in a CCFFH. This is highly
6	desirable. HD 1 made the bill less confusing than the originally submitted bill but the
7	department continues to have concerns.
8	First, HD 1 restricts the relationship to married couples. This would not authorize the
9	department to allow couples in civil unions to live together. The bill should allow civil union
10	couples the same ability.
11	Second, HD 1 continues to require both individuals in the relationship to be private pay.
12	The bill assumes that in a certified 3-bed home, the couples are both private pay while the 3 rd
13	resident is on Medicaid. However, the couple could have different payor sources, that is, the
14	husband could be on Medicaid, the 2 nd resident could be private pay, and the wife could be
15	private pay. In this case the state would not be authorized to allow the couple to live together in
16	the 3-bed home. Instead, the bill should simply authorize the department to allow couples in an
17	objectively verifiable relationship such as married or in a civil union to live together in a 3-bed
18	certified CCFFH regardless of their sources of payments.
19	Third, the bill should also be clear that once the relationship no longer exists the bed must
20	revert back to use for the Medicaid population as was originally intended and as defined in

The bill is intended for a couple to stay in the same community care foster family home to continually create memories together even at their very end years. This will allow communication of their needs, emotional connectivity to ease any physical or mentally condition that an individual may have. It is never interpreted as financial purpose for a provider but for the most part is to provide an importance to an elderly couple's needs to maintain and increase their level of security and awareness to all the community people. This will allow a low cost of financial to a couple's family or themselves rather than placing the other person to an assisted living, nursing homes, or even a private caregiver at their own homes.

Recently, the case at the Big Island which the husband who had depression and later died was pitiful he does not have no one to comfort him. When can we open our senses to these old, frail, and helpless individuals that need more than just a care they need their loved ones to be with them especially for those helpless couples that leave on their own and for those Kapunas who does not wanted to be separated? I hope in my testimony will serve as an eye-opener to everyone here in this room and will spread what we can offer to our Kapunas.

In addition, crisis is looming in Hawaii regarding the care and housing of our elder. Precisely, as the age of our elderly is increasing at an ever-growing rate, the cost of living, the cost of purchasing a house, and the cost of medical care are very expensive. We consider as community resources and we open our homes to every elderly within our community, We are here to serve

the people. Not just to earn a living but because caregiving is "our passion, we love what we are doing, and because these people needs our care and we will continue to serve".

I strongly urge the committee chair to pass HB 600 because we need to uncover the holes, potential problems now, and ongoing basis due to the love and aloha we have for our elderly couples with the crisis of most families being unable to care for them 24 hours a day. It is imperative that we make the proper housing to our elderly amongst us is the highest priority.
