1 Fiscal Implications: No General Funds Required

- 2 **Department Testimony:** The Department of Health strongly supports H.B. 942 which would
- enable the transfer of funds between the Drinking Water Treatment Revolving Loan Fund (also 3
- known as the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund [DWSRF]) and the Water Pollution Control 4
- Revolving Fund (also known as the Clean Water State Revolving Fund [CWSRF]). 5
- 6 The Department currently administers these two (2) low interest loan programs for the
- 7 improvement of public drinking water systems and wastewater treatment and distribution
- systems in Hawaii. These loan programs are funded principally by capitalization grants provided 8
- 9 by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). At the present time, these grants provide
- approximately \$8 million per year to each program. This measure, which gives the Department 10
- the authority to transfer up to 33% of any year's grant between the two programs, would allow 11
- 12 the Department to direct loan monies more efficiently towards the drinking water or wastewater
- infrastructure needs across the State, resulting in the greatest benefit to public health or 13
- 14 environmental protection.
- 15 This measure will help ensure the continued and consistent award of these two (2) annual
- 16 capitalization grants. The EPA oversees the State's implementation of the DWSRF and the
- CWSRF programs and can withhold or delay future capitalization grants whenever a program is 17
- struggling to expeditiously disburse their funds. The ability to move funds between programs 18
- and direct them towards projects that are ready to proceed will help facilitate timely 19
- disbursements. 20
- This measure would also bring the state program in line with the Code of Federal Regulations, 21
- which already allows this transfer authority. The EPA is in support of this measure and views 22
- this as a valuable tool to help ensure that Hawaii retains its full share of state revolving fund 23
- capitalization grants. 24
