House Concurrent Resolution 195/House Resolution 141 requests that the State repair and strongly consider installing water fountains in the State Capitol reflecting pools to effectively clean the pools, reduce costs, and enhance the historic value of the Capitol District. The **Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports the intent of these resolutions and offers the following comments.**

The State Capitol is a unique and iconic historic place. The reflecting pools have been an integral part of its design. The reflecting pools have a number of maintenance issues and are in need of constant attention. The Department believes that maintenance issues with the reflecting pools must be addressed. The Department also believes that the re-installation of water fountains can be achieved in a manner that will not adversely affect the integrity of the State Capitol as a historic property.

The Department looks forward to working with the Legislature and the Department of Accounting and General Services to ensure that necessary maintenance and repairs are accomplished and the historic character of the State Capitol is not diminished.
