Subject: Senate Bill 1021, Relating to Historic Preservation

I am Kurt Kendro, Major of the Kapolei Police Station, Honolulu Police Department (HPD), City and County of Honolulu.

The HPD strongly supports the passage of Senate Bill 1021, Relating to Historic Preservation, which removes the public funds restriction and appropriates general funds for the construction of the state law enforcement memorial.

Hawaii is the only state that does not have a memorial to honor law enforcement officers from the city, county, state, military, and federal agencies who have died in the line of duty while serving the people of Hawaii. Act 14 Session Laws of Hawaii 2011 requires that a state law enforcement memorial be constructed in the Capitol district without the use of public funds.

The Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation has raised \$500,000 towards the construction and has selected a design for the memorial. Despite these efforts, it is not enough to begin and complete construction. The passage of this bill would remove

the requirement that only private funds could be used, and an appropriation of \$250,000 towards the construction and completion of the state law enforcement memorial would be beneficial.

The state law enforcement monument would give all families, friends, community members, and law enforcement personnel a place to celebrate the lives of those officers who selflessly gave their lives to their community so others could be free to live, work, and play.

We strongly urge you to support the passage of Senate Bill 1021, Relating to Historic Preservation.
