**Purpose of Bill:** Establishes an incentive program that provides for incremental loan repayment for teachers serving in high need areas of Hawaii for up to ten years. Also establishes scholarship grants for students pursuing post-secondary degrees in the field of education through the department of education.

### **Department's Position:**

The Department of Education (Department) supports the intent of S.B. 1056. However, the

Department has concerns about the bill as drafted.

The proposed program structure is complex and, as a result, administratively burdensome given the Department's current systems and staffing. The Department anticipates the establishment and maintenance of the program would require substantial monetary resources to fund the incentives and administer the program, whether out-sourced to a third party administrator or staffed by additional Department employees.
