TESTIMONY OF JAN K. YAMANE, ACTING STATE AUDITOR, ON SENATE BILL NO. 1260, RELATING TO RECYCLING

House Committee on Energy & Environmental Protection

March 17, 2015

Chair Lee, Vice Chair Lowen, and Members of the Committee:

I am Jan Yamane, Acting State Auditor. Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of Senate Bill No. 1260. The purpose of this measure is to mandate the Department of Health to adopt and implement the recommendations made in Report No. 14-17, A Study to Identify Local Alternatives to Shipping Non-Deposit Glass out of the State of Hawai'i, which we released in December 2014. We contracted with Oceanit Laboratories, Inc. to conduct the study because our office does not have expertise in environmental issues. Oceanit concluded that before Hawai'i can successfully implement local uses of ADF glass, it must first address significant obstacles to local down-cycling of ADF glass. This measure would require implementation of recommendations made to the Department of Health to address such obstacles.

Thank you again for the opportunity to testify in support of Senate Bill NO. 1260. I am available to answer any questions you may have.

- 1 **Fiscal Implications:** Unknown
- 2 **Department Testimony:** The Department offers comments on this measure. The goal of this
- 3 measure is "...to mandate the department of health to adopt and implement the recommendations
- 4 made by the office of the Auditor." This measure requires the Department to: 1) perform a cost-
- 5 benefit analysis of, and consider, combining the Glass Advance Disposal Fee (ADF) and Deposit
- 6 Beverage Container programs; 2) update the Department's 2008 Draft Glass Recycling Policy; 3)
- 7 work with stakeholders to make practical policies and rules governing the stockpiling of glass;
- and 4) increase the recovery rate of ADF glass to 75%.
- 9 This measure may be unnecessary as the Department is actively following up on the Auditor's
- recommendations. Given the Auditor's focus on administrative issues, we are focusing our
- initial response on tightening contract management, specifically beginning with revising the
- scopes of services in our contracts with the counties. We will also be implementing written
- procedures for contract administration, accounting, and the collection and compilation of data
- that will be used in consideration of future program changes. We believe that these are the
- logical first steps in follow-up to the Auditor's report.
- While we understand the desire to make some of the changes proposed by this bill, we believe
- that it is premature to do so at this point. That is not to say that some, or all, of the changes will
- not be considered, only that we will consider and analyze these proposals after we have
- completed analysis of all county programs and have begun collection of more comprehensive

1	data. We assure you that we will include all pertinent stakeholders as we continue our analysis
2	and in developing proposals to modify and improve the glass ADF program.

The Hawaii Food Industry Association is comprised of two hundred member companies representing retailers, suppliers, producers, and distributors of food and beverage related products in the State of Hawaii.

We support the intent of this measure and believe that the Advance Disposal Fee Program should adopt many of the recommendations made in the December 2014, Audit of the Department of Health's Glass Advance Disposal Fee Program. We are also very supportive of the section of this measure that would update and finalize the 2008 Department of Health Policy Glass Recycling Draft dated July 1, 2008, to equally allow recycling or down-cycling.

We would ask that this measure be revised to remove the paragraph (1) of Section 1 and paragraph (1) of Section 2, which recommend considering combining the Advance Disposal Fee processing stream with the Deposit Beverage Container glass processing stream. We believe that a clear distinction must be maintained between the two programs and that in order for the ADF Program and the HI-5 program to both operate at optimum levels and accomplish their separate goals it is important that they continue to be separate programs.

Combining the programs on any level which would lead to the ADF being changed to \$.05 or lead to the ADF being charged to customers themselves will lead to an increased financial burden on customers and/or businesses and will not further the recycling goals of the state.

The Audit discusses among the problems associated with the ADF is that it is viewed by the Health Department as "an appendage to the larger Deposit Beverage Container Program". We believe that any attempt to combine

the programs will exacerbate the already considerable issues with the ADF which were identified in the Audit, and we therefore ask that this measure be amended as noted above.
