As a society, we need to help make amends for the loss imposed on them by the criminal justice system, and to help them become productive citizens.

Remember that these people have been wrongfully convicted and should not have had their lives disrupted at all. Money and immediate services (housing, job assistance, food) is not going to put them a back to where they would have been, but it is a significant benefit and one that they both need and are entitled to. Please join the majority of states and the federal government in recognizing that this is a debt that society owes and pass the redress law for people wrongfully convicted and imprisoned.
