1 **Fiscal Implications:** None.

2 **Department Testimony:** The purpose of the measure is to amend the principal state agencies 3 representatives on the State Council on Mental Health and to redefine quorum. As specified in Section 334-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the principal state agencies representatives on the 4 5 Council are: mental health, education, vocational rehabilitation, criminal justice, housing and 6 social services. Since social services is under the Department of Human Services and represents 7 the Child Welfare Services, which provides the Council with perspectives on systems change for children with mental illness, it is also important to add the Medicaid agency which provides 8 9 services to many of our adult consumers living with mental illness. The passing of this measure will allow the Council to gain the Medicaid agency's knowledge and expertise on issues and 10 trends that influence the direction in which the mental health field is headed in the State of 11 Hawaii. 12

The Council meets monthly, and based on the number of meetings during the fiscal year 2015, only four meetings were held where quorum was achieved. The re-definition of quorum will enable the Council to conduct business based on the number of currently appointed members and not based on the number of vacancies. 1 We thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on behalf of this body of

volunteers, who give their time and effort in supporting consumers living with mental illness inour State.

1, line 3, "\$334-10, State council on mental health. (a) There is
established, within the department of health for administrative
