My name is Jerry Ornellas and I support SB2217. I am the president of the East Kauai Water Users' Cooperative which has managed the Stateowned reservoir and ditch system in the Kapaa/Kalepa area for the past 14 years.

The bill is intended to supply needed cash support for the operation and maintenance our system which receives more than \$150,000 per year in volunteer labor, fees and donations.

Over the last four years, the State has invested strategically in the system, most notably with the completed renovation and upgrade of Wailua Reservoir, the renovation of Upper Kapahi Reservoir now underway and Aahoaka reservoir, which should begin soon.

Beside the shortfall in operation and maintenance, there remain important repairs which must be tended to least they become major issues down the road. Our system provides irrigation water to a number of farmers, ranchers and householders in the Kapaa and Kalepa areas. It is critical to a dynamic homegrown agriculture industry on Kauai's East Side.

I am Randy Cabral, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interest of our diverse agricultural community.

HFB strongly supports SB 2217, SD2, which appropriates funds for the operation, repair, maintenance, and improvement of the East Kauai Water Irrigation System by the East Kauai Irrigation Users' Cooperative irrigation systems.

The East Kauai Water Users' Cooperative, a volunteer group, has operated the East Kauai Irrigation System for more than nine years, servicing more than 12,500 acres of agricultural land. Without the volunteer effort of the cooperative, the 21-mile irrigation system would have been abandoned and Kauai farmers left without water.

The repair and maintenance of our irrigation systems is critical. Our farmers and ranchers depend on these irrigation systems for their operations. We are writing today in favor of SB2217. We are current users of this water system and a founder member of the East Kauai Water Users' Cooperative Board of Directors. The water supplied by the system is very important to the Church for both its 70 acres of fee-simple land Wailua Homesteads and its 300+ acres on Kalepa lands now held by the Church under a 35-year license agreement with ADC.

The agriculture industry remains an essential component of Hawaii's economic landscape and is only possible with a reliable supply of water. The East Kauai system can irrigate 4,000 acres of productive farm land which has in past years produced millions of dollars worth of sugar cane. Its multiple reservoirs and 30 plus miles of ditch are an irreplaceable State-owned resource valued by experts at hundreds of millions of dollars.

The State is amply justified in providing partial support for operation and maintenance and well as on-going reparis to a system which enjoys a strong volunteer effort.
