RE: S.B. 227; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI.

Chair Espero, Chair Keith-Agaran, Vice Chair Baker, Vice-Chair Shimabukuro, members of the Senate Committee on Public Safety, Intergovernmental and Military Affairs, and members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary, the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the City and County of Honolulu ("Department") submits the following testimony in <u>strong support</u> of S.B. 227.

Since Hawaii's first Drug Court Program was incepted on Oahu in 1996, Drug Court has expanded to the islands of Hawai'i, Kaua'i, Maui, and Moloka'i, serving offenders within those criminal court and Family Court systems. Because the design and structure of each Drug Court is developed locally, these programs are unique and sensitive to the cultural population of each island, while remaining consistent with the benefits of drug court programs nationwide. These programs are also an efficient use of State resources, with Adult Drug Court costing about \$137/day in comparison to incarceration that costs seven times more, and Juvenile Drug Court costing \$227/day in comparison to incarceration that costs six times more. Deputy prosecuting attorneys play an important role in Drug Court-ensuring that this program is a success--and truly want to see offenders turn their lives around; this, in turn, also decreases criminal activity in our communities.

Mental health courts, another state mandated program, also play a key role in assuring that offenders receive appropriate treatment. Deputy prosecuting attorneys work hard in these courtrooms to pursue appropriate prosecution and proper sentencing in these matters.

For all of the foregoing reasons, the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney strongly supports the passage of S.B. 227, which will provide the funding needed to maximize services in the community, in the fields of Drug Court and Mental Health Court. Also, as the legislative session progresses, we kindly request that the funding in this bill be inserted into the State Budget, along with similarly necessary funding for each county prosecutor. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this matter.

The Department of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Maui, STRONGLY SUPPORTS SB 227 - Making Appropriations to the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Maui. SB 227 appropriates funds to the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Maui for the prosecution of cases under the drug court and metal health court programs.

When the Judiciary created the drug and mental health court programs, the Department had no option but to comply by prosecuting qualifying cases in those court programs. The

impact on the Department is that each court has dedicated to it one deputy prosecutor and one law technician. The following expenses are related to those positions:

The Department has already absorbed much of the expenses of other state-mandated programs (Career Criminal Prosecution and Victim/Witness Assistance). The Department appreciates any financial assistance it can receive to help it meet its mandated responsibility.

Accordingly, the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Maui, STRONGLY SUPPORTS the passage of this bill. We ask that the committee PASS SB 227.
