Also, the license allows Hawaii to sanction individuals who are unsafe and remove them from practice.

Finally, as healthcare moves more into nontraditional areas of care such as telemedicine, home care, skilled nursing facilities and rehabilitation there will be greater need to assure safety and quality. Respiratory therapists in Hawaii no longer work just for hospitals and the license increases the ability of the state and the profession to maintain and monitor the actions of these essential workers.

Chairs and Committee Members:

I strongly support SB 2341, SD1 which would eliminate the sunset provision of respiratory care practitioners' licenses and make such regulation permanent.

My name is Valerie Chang. I am Executive Director of the Hawaii COPD Coalition. Our organization provides services and support to Hawaii's people affected by Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease, more commonly known as emphysema, chronic bronchitis and similar conditions. COPD is the third leading cause of death in the US and a major cause of disability in the US and worldwide. Over 56,000 Hawaii adults have COPD. Many, many more people in Hawaii suffer from asthma, tuberculosis, pneumonia and other respiratory conditions.

Respiratory Therapists are a very important of the healthcare team for COPD patients and their loved ones. They help the patients get their medication, keep their lungs clear, and learn to manage their breathing conditions. As has been noted, it is very significant that only Alaska lacks certification for respiratory therapists. Have a certification process in place and certifying the respiratory therapists will help to insure that all of our therapists meet appropriate standards and are providing quality care to our many people in Hawaii who need respiratory care. Respiratory therapists are those who are charged with keeping the airways clear to keep patients alive in hospital settings, as well as training patients how to use their new medications and equipment, including ventilators for lungs too tired to breathe on their own, CPAP for Obstructive Sleep Apnea, oxygen for people whose lungs cannot provide enough oxygen throughout their bodies, and much, much more.

As mentioned in paragraph two of the bill, the legislature has found from the auditor's report from June 2015 that the regulation of respiratory therapists is reasonably necessary to protect the health and safety of consumers and consistent with other health-related occupations.

My husband, children, and I have asthma and additionally, I have severe emphysema. We have all used the services of respiratory therapists to test how well our lungs are working. I have also been fortunate enough to have a respiratory therapist in Colorado help me develop a personalized exercise program which is safe and appropriate for my lung condition. Respiratory nurses and respiratory therapists have also provided me with education on how to live actively with asthma and emphysema.

I have also enjoyed working with many respiratory therapists with our Hawaii COPD Coalition where we:

(1) Conducted free breathing testing at various locations throughout the state;

(2) Hold regular free support groups (run by respiratory therapist and health educator); and

(3) Hold a free annual education day with many respiratory therapists participating.

I strongly SUPPORT the prompt passage of legislation to establish licensing and regulatory requirements for practice of respiratory care and to create a board for respiratory care, as written in SB 2341, SD1. Please do not hesitate to contact me if I can provide any additional information.
