## Senate Bill No. 2455 Relating to Grievances

# CHAIRPERSON KIM, VICE CHAIR IHARA AND MEMBERS OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS:

S.B. 2455 requires DHRD to submit an annual report to the legislature on the number of grievances filed by public employees.

The Department of Human Resources Development (DHRD) has concerns

regarding this bill for the following reasons:

The Office of Information Practices has confirmed that because the bill only

seeks statistical data regarding grievances filed during the specified time period, our

department would be able to provide the data to the legislature upon request. Because

the grievance data can be provided in response to a request, it appears that S.B. No.

2455 is not needed.

In addition, S.B. 2455 requires a report on "public employee grievances." DHRD

would be able to provide grievance data only as it relates to executive branch agencies. Our department does not have access to grievance data relating to the other public employer jurisdictions, including the DOE, UH, Judiciary, HHSC and the counties.
