SENATE BILL NO. 2541 RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Chairs Wakai and Tokuda, Vice Chairs Slom and Dela Cruz, and Committee Members:

My name is Todd Nacapuy, Chief Information Officer (CIO) of the State of Hawai'i. I am testifying in support of Senate Bill No. 2541, Relating to Information Technology, which clarifies the State CIO's authority, with approval of the governor, to transfer and expend general funds and non-general funds appropriated in the 2015 Executive Budget (Act 119) to executive departments and agencies for projects approved by the CIO-led Office of Enterprise Technology Services.

Act 119 did not specifically permit the transfer of general funds to the expending departments. This bill authorizes the CIO to transfer funds appropriated in Act 119 to the departments. This is part of the State's new information technology (IT) governance process that evaluates, approves and monitors IT investments and projects. Those processes will ensure that State resources are managed and completed successfully.

S.B. No. 2541 is also consistent with recommendations made in ETS' Report to the Legislature on Expenditures and the Operational and Financial Feasibility of Sustaining IT Governance, submitted December 31, 2015, pursuant to Section 41 of Act 119, SLH 2015.
