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TESTIMONY OF JAN K. YAMANE, ACTING STATE AUDITOR, ON SENATE BILL NO. 2551, HD1, RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS

Chair Luke and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of this bill. SB 2551, HD1, would require the Judiciary to submit information on all non-general funds it manages.

In 2015, we reviewed the non-general funds of the Judiciary (Report No. 15-16) and concluded that the Judiciary submits annual reports of special and revolving funds, but does not submit such reports for all statutorily and administratively created trust funds and trust accounts because the Judiciary is specifically exempt under Section 37-52.5, HRS. However, we noted that annual reporting of each non-general fund account is the primary means through which legislative money committees can track the Judiciary's non-general funds, thus underscoring the importance of this reporting function. We suggest amendments to the HD1 to specifically include the Judiciary under Section 37-52.5, HRS, because the Judiciary is not a department or agency, but a separate branch of government. A copy of the bill noting such changes is attached for your consideration.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the judiciary should
report to the legislature on all non-general funds managed by
the judiciary, including administratively established accounts
and funds. The legislature finds it is necessary to be informed
of the total fiscal situation of the State to make sound
budgetary decisions.

7 The purpose of this Act is to require the judiciary to 8 report annually to the legislature on accounts and funds that 9 are administratively established and managed by the judiciary. 10 This Act deletes an exemption for the judiciary in section 37-11 52.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and thereby subjects the 12 judiciary to the same reporting requirements on these accounts 13 and funds as the executive branch departments.

14 SECTION 2. Section 37-52.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended to read as follows:

16 "§37-52.5 Criteria for the establishment and continuance
17 of administratively established accounts and funds. (a)

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1	The Judiciary and any [Except for the judiciary, any][Any] department or agency that
2	administratively establishes any new account or fund, within
3	thirty working days of its establishment, shall transmit a
4	report to the legislature. The report to the legislature shall
5	include:
6	(1) The justification for the establishment of the account
7	or fund; and
8	(2) The sources of revenue for the fund.
9	The judiciary and lach (b) [Except for the judiciary, each] [Each] department or
10	agency, at least twenty days prior to the convening of each
11	regular session, shall submit a report to the legislature. The
12	report shall include:
13	(1) A list of all administratively established accounts or
14	funds; and
15	(2) All revenues, expenditures, encumbrances, and ending
16	balances of each account or fund."
17	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
