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TESTIMONY OF JAN K. YAMANE, ACTING STATE AUDITOR, ON SENATE BILL NO. 2551, RELATING TO NON-GENERAL FUNDS

Chair Rhoads and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify in support of this bill. SB 2551 would require the Judiciary to submit information on all non-general funds it manages.

In 2015, we reviewed the non-general funds of the Judiciary (Report No. 15-16) and concluded that the Judiciary submits annual reports of special and revolving funds, but does not submit such reports for all statutorily and administratively created trust funds and trust accounts because the Judiciary is specifically exempt under Section 37-52.5, HRS. However, we noted that annual reporting of each non-general fund account is the primary means through which legislative money committees can track the Judiciary's non-general funds, thus underscoring the importance of this reporting function.
