## **Department's Position:**

The Department of Education takes **no position on SB 2610** but would respectfully like to provide comments for the committee's consideration.

Composition of the Committee on Weights (COW) is currently determined by action of the Board of Education (BOE), based on recommendations from the BOE's Finance and Instructure Committee (FIC). The FIC recommendation is partially informed by a proposal from the superintendent and dean of the college of education.

There are opportunities for public testimony at the BOE's General Business Meeting and FIC meeting. There was no input provided via testimony at any of these meetings regarding the COW composition.

It should be noted that members of the COW in recent years have all been members on school community councils. Most of the previous COWs have included a member who was a special education teacher. Members come from various school sizes, geographic areas, islands, and role groups (including teachers, principals, classified staff, and community members). Participants on the COW have been expected to not limit their role on the committee to one of advocacy for any one segment of the school community or student population.

Dear Chair Kidani and Members of the Committee,

The Special Education Advisory Council (SEAC), Hawaii's State Advisory Panel under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), **supports** SB 2610 that requires at least one member of the Committee on Weights to be a representative of the special education community.

SEAC has steadfastly supported that funding for special education staff positions be provided on a categorical basis, rather than trying to assign a weight to learners with such a diverse range of needs. Students with disabilities, like all students, do receive a baseline weight, however, and some may also have additional characteristics such as being economically disadvantated or learning English as a second language that result in more funding to provide their supports. It is therefore critical that there be someone with special education expertise on the Committee on Weights to provide representation for this group. SEAC approves the suggestion that this representative might be a teacher or parent of disabled children.
