conservation.

Watershed protection and invasive species management significantly increases water availability by ensuring that our forests function to effectively absorb rain, deliver it into streams and aquifers, and decrease erosion and siltation, which also benefits our reefs and fisheries. This is especially urgent in the face of climate change and projected long-term decline in rainfall. Protection of Hawai'i's coastal communities, ocean resources and fisheries also requires action and investment.

HGG public-private partners identified SB2773 SD1 as an important shared 2016 legislative priority to advance the *Aloha+ Challenge* natural resource goals. The *Aloha+ Challenge* is a statewide commitment by the State Legislature (SCR 69), Governor, Mayors and Office of Hawaiian Affairs to achieve six sustainability goals for 2030 in the areas of clean energy, local food, natural resources, solid waste reduction, smart growth and climate resilience, and green jobs and education. Statewide HGG public-private partners are identifying shared measures to track progress and provide accountability with the online *Aloha+ Challenge* Dashboard, while developing an annual policy and action agenda to advance Hawai'i's shared 2030 sustainability goals. The *Aloha+ Challenge* has been recognized nationally and internationally by the US State Department and Global Island Partnership as a model for locally appropriate implementation of UN Sustainable Development Goals.

As a public-private partnership, Hawai'i Green Growth supports SB2773 SD1 to help drive implementation on the Aloha+ Nature goal, and demonstrate the state's commitment and investment in natural resource management to national and international conservation partners at the World Conservation Congress and beyond.
