Chair Wakai, Vice Chair Slom, and Members of the Committee on Economic Development, Environment, and Technology.

The High Technology Development Corporation (HTDC) **supports** SB2819 that changes the agency's name from the High Technology Development Corporation to the Hawaii Technology Development Corporation.

The revised name would better communicate to the public the function of the Corporation. In 1983 when HRS 206M was adopted, "high technology" was defined as "industries that are technology-intensive, including but not limited to electronics, biotechnology, software, computers, telecommunications, and other computer-related technologies". In 2015, with the ubiquitousness of computers, electronics and software, these industries are simply referred to as the "technology" sector. The term "high technology" implies a small subset of the technology sector related to research and development.

Furthermore, technology companies today operate across a range of industries ranging from ag-tech and clean tech to manufacturing and photonics. The revised name is more inclusive and will enable HTDC to better work with companies in all industries that have a technology core.

As part of HTDC's vision to create 80,000 new innovation jobs in Hawaii earning \$80,000 or more by 2030, HTDC supports initiatives aimed at promoting technology and innovation jobs.
