TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL NO. 2863 S.D.2 RELATING TO CITATIONS FOR MASSAGE THERAPY VIOLATIONS

TO THE HONORABLE ANGUS L.K. MCKELVEY, CHAIR, AND TO THE HONORABLE JUSTIN H. WOODSON, VICE CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Department")

appreciates the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill No. 2863 S.D.2, Relating to

Citations for Massage Therapy Violations. My name is Daria Loy-Goto and I am the

Complaints and Enforcement Officer for the Department's Regulated Industries

Complaints Office ("RICO"). The Department strongly supports this Administration

bill.

Senate Bill No. 2863 S.D.2 establishes a citation process as an additional

enforcement tool to address four existing, technical massage therapy violations by

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licensees: (1) failing to conspicuously display a massage therapy establishment license and all licenses and permits of persons employed by the establishment who practice massage therapy; (2) failing to identify all apprentices working at a massage therapy establishment; (3) operating without a principal massage therapist or licensed designee in attendance; and (4) failing to include a current license number in any advertisement. The fine for such violations would be fixed at \$250.00 per violation. Under current Hawaii law, RICO can request fines up to \$1,000.00 per violation.

The citation process requires personal service of the citation upon the licensee and affords the licensee the opportunity to request a hearing to contest the citation within twenty calendar days. Senate Bill No. 2863 S.D.2 also provides that failure to pay any assessed fine within thirty calendar days may subject the licensee to further disciplinary action.

Currently, in order to prosecute an alleged violation, a RICO staff attorney must file a formal petition for disciplinary action, attend a pre-hearing conference, and then attend a formal hearing. Senate Bill No. 2863 S.D.2 will expedite RICO's enforcement of certain technical violations of the massage therapy laws. RICO believes this citation process will efficiently promote compliance and enable RICO staff to concentrate its efforts and resources on more serious violations.

RICO notes that the House companion measure, House Bill No. 2334, was not heard by any House committee.
