#### 1 Fiscal Implications: None.

- 2 **Department Testimony:** The department opposes the bill as we feel it is unnecessary. The
- 3 department is in the process of revising HAR 11-50, Food Safety Code, to allow for annual
- 4 "special event" food establishment permits for vendors at farmers markets that direct sale
- 5 potentially hazardous foods that comply with DOH HAR.
- 6 Present rules already allow direct consumer sales of non-potentially hazardous foods without a
- 7 DOH permit. The revised rules will not change this practice.
- 8 The initial draft copy of the revised HAR 11-50 has been reviewed by the Deputy AG and the
- 9 initial review has concluded that all changes described are legal and are currently being reviewed
- 10 for consistency and legal terminology only. The AG review should be complete in a few days,
- 11 and is the last step before the department starts preparation to go to public hearings.
- 12 **Offered Amendments:** No amendments offered.

Aloha Chair Gabbard, Vice Chair Nishihara, and Members of the Committee:

I am Randy Cabral, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,900 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interest of our diverse agricultural community.

**HFB is in strong support of SB 2989**, which establishes Farmers' Market Vendors as part of Chapter 145, Regulation of Farm Produce, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

With the recent growth in farmers' markets and the demand for local, fresh foods, there has been a push to allow farmers to direct-market their produce without Department of Health regulation as well as to to produce and sell specific non-potentially hazardous value-added agricultural products made in their homes. The report prepared by Harvard Law School shows that Hawaii is currently behind the trend set by over 30 states to allow in-home production and sale of certain low-risk or non-potentially hazardous foods like baked goods, jams, jellies, and dried herbs without being required to use a certified kitchen, apply to the DOH for a permit, or ask for an exemption.

Farmers' Market Vendors of agricultural products in Hawaii currently are supposed to apply to the Department of Health Sanitation Branch every 120 days under the Temporary Food Establishment law even to sell fresh, raw fruits and produce. This provides for Farmers to sell only twenty out of 120 days. We believe the Temporary Food Establishment law was never intended to regulate scheduled farmers' markets.

The Land Use Research Foundation of Hawaii (LURF) is a private, non-profit research and trade association whose members include major Hawaii landowners, developers and a utility company. One of LURF's missions is to advocate for reasonable, rational and equitable land use planning, legislation and regulations that encourage wellplanned economic growth and development, while safeguarding Hawaii's significant natural and cultural resources and public health and safety.

As an advocate for the various agricultural stakeholder groups who defend the goals of viable agricultural operations and the conservation and protection of agriculture, including important agricultural lands in Hawaii, LURF supports this measure which supports the need to mitigate the risks involved in food production by identifying good agricultural practices and preventative measure guidelines to ensure safe food throughout the State's agricultural industry and the farm-to-consumer food supply system.

**SB 2989.** This bill requires farmers market vendors that direct-market potentially hazardous value added products to obtain a permit from the Department of Health (DOH); exempts non-potentially hazardous value added products from DOH permitting or inspection; and establishes labeling requirements for value added products sold at farmers markets.

**LURF's Position.** Agricultural safety is vital for the safe and secure production, processing, sale, distribution, importation and consumption of food products and agricultural commodities in Hawaii. This bill will assist in the support and establishment of good agricultural practices and preventative measures in order to meet food safety objectives and standards, and effectively comply with applicable governmental rules, regulations and guidelines.

LURF understands that such practices and measures are necessary on a local level in order that the State may, amongst other things, improve the overall safety of locally grown food, and ensure that local food safety regulations and certifications conform to governmental and other uniform requirements and standards.

This push toward good practices and acceptable measures of agricultural safety which are transparent to all is needed in Hawaii. Establishment of regulations and standards will provide a practical means for the State to support agriculture, and will assist the State in its effort to attain increased food self-sufficiency and sustainability.

Based on the above, LURF **supports SB 2989**, and respectfully urges your favorable consideration of the bill.

Comments: I realize this is designed to help farmers sell products without the health department stepping in and imposing difficult hurdles. Great! However, one aspect I feel needs to be addressed in this or related legislation is to require labeling of GMOs (transgenic genetically-modified organisms) in value-added foods. For examples, ulu chips sold at our farmers' market are cooked in GMO canola oil, and not labeled at all; jams and jellies are made with GMO sugar; GMO corn tortillas are sold there too. Thousands of doctors are now recommending that their patients avoid GMOs and the associated chemicals, such as glyphosate, due to deleterious health impacts.
