Subject: Senate Bill (SB) 3061 Relating to Public Safety

I am Socrates Bratakos, Administrator of the Hawaii State Fire Council (SFC) and Assistant Chief of the Honolulu Fire Department (HFD). The SFC and the HFD support SB 3061, which proposes to allow the State of Hawaii State Department of Defense Emergency Management Agency to provide administrative oversight for 25 civilian community teams and to hire a coordinator to establish the teams and ensure they are property trained to assist city, state, and federal personnel during natural or human caused disasters, and to appropriate funds.

In the event of a disaster first responders and other government agencies will be taxed to its maximum limits. Establishing and training civilian teams is a proactive measure to assist members of their community who will be in need of assistance.

The SFC and the HFD fully support this measure and urge your committee's passage of SB 3061.
