#### In consideration of SENATE BILL 313 RELATING TO THE HAWAII ASSOCIATION OF CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

Senate Bill 313 proposes to appropriate \$350,000 of general revenues in Fiscal Year (FY) 2015-2016 and FY 2016-2017 for operating expenses and staffing costs of the Hawaii Association of Conservation Districts (HACD). The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this bill provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact priorities indicated in our Executive Budget request.

The Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) Program was established pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes Chapter 180 and is administratively attached to the Department. The purpose of the program is to educate, construct, maintain, and assist in the development of conservation plans to protect soil and water resources. Each of the 16 SWCDs is governed by a five-member volunteer board. HACD is an umbrella organization formed by the 16 districts. In FY 2014-2015, HACD and the SWCDs will receive a total of \$68,400 in general funds and \$210,000 in interdepartmental transfer funds from the Department of Agriculture for their operations through the Department's LNR 141 Program. Other required funds for their operation, staffing and implementation of projects must be sought in the form of grants from other agencies.

Aloha Chair Solomon, Vice Chair Galuteria, and Members of the Committee:

I am Christopher Manfredi, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFBF is comprised of 1,932 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

**HFB strongly supports SB 313**, which seeks an appropriation for the Hawaii Association of Conservation Districts to assist with its staffing of Conservation Specialists.

The Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCD) are mandated by HRS §180. The SWCD is comprised of volunteer directors that are closely tied to Island communities. Many of these SWCD directors are also farmers, ranchers and members of HFB. They understand the issues related to land use, stewardship, resource management and agriculture.

The 16 SWCDs assist the agricultural communities throughout the entire State. They help farmers and ranchers develop and process conservation plans and address issues relating to erosion, water quality, agricultural water, and grading and grubbing plan reviews.

State of Hawaii Department of Health (DOH) has historically funded districts \$207,000 annually, for the staffing of Conservation Specialists. Effective December 31, 2013, DOH totally eliminated these funds and has not provided any replacement funding. Thus there is a backlog of conservation plans throughout parts of the State (particularly Oahu).

Under these tough economic times, the SWCDs funding continues to get squeezed at the State, County and Federal levels. The requested funds, while nominal, are vitally important for farmers, ranchers, agricultural landowners, livestock, wildlife, the environment and the present and future citizens of the State of Hawaii.

Since all SWCD Directors are unpaid volunteers, SWCDs take pressure off county planning departments and help alleviate backlogs. In working through public-private partnerships, SWCDs provide free engineering services and technical assistance for low-impact projects. These cost savings are reflected in lower food and foliage production costs that are ultimately saved by consumers and make Hawaii's producers more competitive in the marketplace.

HFB considers the SWCDs a vital partner in Hawaii's agricultural Industry and our Island communities.

#### Please pass SB 313.

#### SENATE COMMITTEE ON WATER AND LAND TESTIMONY ON SB313 RELATING TO THE HAWAII ASSOCIATION OF CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

Chair Thielen, Vice Chair Galuteria, and Members of the Committee;

MCFB is in strong support of HB 439, providing funding for the Hawaii Association of Conservation Districts. We support the comments provided by the Hawaii Association of Conservation Districts(HACD).

During a recent meeting, it was said that stewardship is accomplished with one foot in agriculture and another in conservation, connected with common sense. Our Hawaii State Constitution addresses the need agricultural sustainability and increased self sufficiency. Farmers and ranchers need many tools to grow crops and raise livestocks successfully while protecting the environment for future generations. The services of HACD is a critical component addressing this need. HACD is the over-arching body uniting the Soil and Water Conservation Districts(SWCD) across the state. HACD partners with the Federal USDA Natural Resources Conservation Services that provides technical training along with facilities and equipment and counties that provide additional staffing support specifically for activities beyond the scope of staff and resources addressed in this measure. The importance of the SWCDs is highlighted in its' origin. Before the formation of SWCDs across the country, there was a lack of adoption of conservation practices despite the clear need to protect soil and water. The Federal Government recognized the need of a bottoms up approach that created the SWCD as the mechanism to deliver the research and practices to result in conservation measures on the ground. The members of the SWCD are largely volunteers. The dollars requested in this measure funds technical personnel that prepare conservation plans to ensure farmers and ranchers are able to have sound stewardship practices.

Historically, funds were allocated as part of the barrel tax funds and the DLNR budget. Starting in January 2014, DOH has decided that these funds should not be part of the barrel tax, resulting in an emergency legislative appropriation in the spring of 2013, followed by an appropriation in 2014 that allowed the organization to function. This year, the two budgetary requests are combined into one item to streamline the funding source and clarify the total dollars associated with the program.

During these financially difficult times, HACD provides an excellent example of public-private partnerships to address the needs of society. If HACD were a pure government function, its' cost will be multifold, without the ability to cover the range of services delivered today. Hiring 80 plus people that currently assist in the program would be unreasonable. In addition to meeting conservation needs, HACD is also the body that works with the Federal Government to bring federal resources for water source development. Many of the large infrastructures across the state were funded through this process. Most recently, the Lahaina flood control system, Upcountry Dual Line and Hamakua Ditch are funded through this process. Our delegates are in Louisiana this week seeking additional federal funding to increase Hawaii's capacity to address droughts.

MCFB respectfully requests your strong support of this measure.
