Chair Espero, Vice Chair Baker and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Maui, submits these COMMENTS regarding SB 473, Relating to Firearms. SB 473 will codify federal law to authorize the Department of the Attorney General to develop and implement a state program to allow active and retired law enforcement officers to carry a concealed firearm in Hawaii pursuant to the federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act ("LEOSA") of 2003.

We believe codifying the federal statute is unnecessary. However, we do believe that there should be specific authorization given to the Department of the Attorney General, including rulemaking authority. The Department of the Attorney General currently runs the LEOSA program under its general law enforcement authority, and specific statutory authorization will assist the Department of the Attorney General in handling this task.

#### Aloha Senator Espero!

My name is Katheryn DeMilo-Fytros and I am a retired Police Captain from the Mount Vernon New York Police Department. I honorably served 25 years. Since retiring, I moved to Kauai and have lived here for 17 years.

The purpose of the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act (LEOSA) is to allow persons with a lifetime of law enforcement experience to continue to protect the public as well as themselves and it is being used well in New York.

The State of Hawaii, which administers this program in collaboration with the police chiefs of all of the counties, has made the process difficult and onerous. Many retirees are discouraged from even attempting to apply under this federal law. Here are some of the roadblocks placed in our path:

- 1. No renewal process: the same paperwork including notarized forms, copies of registrations, and signed releases must be submitted every year, regardless if the applicant currently holds a permit.
- 2. An annual qualification course that requires applicants to shoot a perfect score using a course of fire that was created specifically to eliminate as many applicants as possible. The 2010 Amendment to LEOSA specifies using the qualification course used by the agency the applicant retired from. There are no Police Departments that require a perfect score for qualification. Mount Vernon as well as New York City required 70 percent. Despite the change in the law, the course of fire remains the same and the Attorney General's office failed to comply with the new law.
- 3. Applicants are required to pay \$104.00 to a contractor, who conducts the qualification, prior to shooting the qualification course. That amount is forfeited if the applicant cannot pass with a perfect score and no retries are allowed. I have been a firearms instructor for 30 years and have yet to encounter a qualification course such as the one we are required to shoot every year.
- 4. Applicants must supply the envelopes and postage, to include certified mail with return receipt.

5. Applicants must have a physical, hearing exam and eye exam done at their own expense every two years.

Ironically, retired mainland officers, many of whom are spared a difficult application process, can carry a firearm in Hawaii under LEOSA while officers who retired in-state face obstacles. Specifically, I was provided a retirement Identification card which I believe retiring Officers from Kauai are denied.

We ask that the law be applied equally and that the unreasonable conditions arbitrarily enacted by the State and Counties of Hawaii be amended.

I support the provision in the bill that would limit civil liability for firearm instructors and that this limitation be extended to police departments who allow LEOSA applicants to use police firing ranges for qualification purposes.

I doubt if there are ANY law enforcement agencies in the state that mandates a perfect score in order to pass. - 3. Applicants are required to pay \$104.00 to a contractor, who conducts the qualification, prior to shooting the qualification course. That amount is forfeited if the applicant cannot pass with a perfect score and no retries are allowed. I have been a firearms instructor for 30 years and have yet to encounter a qualification course such as the one we are required to shoot every year.
- Applicants must supply the envelopes and postage, to include certified mail with return receipt.
- 5. Applicants must have a physical done at their own expense every two years.

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Ironically retired mainland officers, many of whom are spared a lengthy and difficult application process, can carry a firearm in Hawaii under LEOSA while officers who retired in-state face unfair obstacles.

We ask that the law be applied equally and that the unreasonable conditions arbitrarily enacted by the State and Counties be amended. I support the provision in the bill that would limit civil liability for firearm instructors and that this limitation be extended to police departments who allow LEOSA applicants to use police firing ranges for qualification purposes.
