# **SB 579**

## **RELATING TO UNMANNED AIRCRAFTS**

Prohibits the use of unmanned aircrafts, except by law enforcement agencies, to conduct surveillance and establishes certain conditions for law enforcement agencies to use an unmanned aircraft to obtain information. Exempts the use of model aircrafts for commercial, hobby, or recreational purposes. Requires all law enforcement agencies using unmanned aircrafts and the courts to report on their activities relating to unmanned aircrafts.

#### **RELATING TO UNMANNED AIRCRAFTS.**

Chairs Espero and Nishihara, Vice Chairs Baker and Harimoto, and Members of the Committees. Although the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism appreciates the general intent of this bill to help address privacy issues associated with the use of unmanned aircraft, it is concerned that: (1) there already is an existing body of federal, state and local laws relating to privacy that would apply to the operation of unmanned aerial systems (UAS) by government, commercial, and private operators; and (2) that any new legislation intended to address privacy concerns regarding UAS avoids establishing regulations that would prohibit the numerous applications of this technology that can provide a wide range of economic, environmental, safety, and security benefits to the general public.

To better address this complex issue, the Aerospace States Association, in collaboration with the Council of State Governments and the National Conference of State Legislatures, have developed a list of considerations for states to evaluate in developing UAS legislation, and we would recommend your reviewing these factors before enacting State legislation that would impact UAS applications in Hawaii (these considerations may be accessed online at <u>http://aerostates.org/events/uas-state-privacy-considerations</u>).

#### In Consideration of **SENATE BILL 579 RELATING TO UNMANNED AIRCRAFTS**

Senate Bill 579 proposes to prohibit the use of unmanned aircrafts and provides certain exceptions for use by law enforcement to conduct surveillance and establishes certain conditions for law enforcement agencies to use an unmanned aircraft to obtain information. Senate Bill 579 requires all law enforcement agencies using unmanned aircrafts and the courts to report on their activities relating to unmanned aircrafts. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) offers the following comments regarding this measure.

The Department's Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement (DOCARE) is charged with enforcing the State's natural resources laws and regulations. Much of the state lands patrolled by DOCARE are undeveloped and geographically remote making access to these areas difficult and often dangerous.

Senate Bill 579 proposes to provide certain exceptions for the use of unmanned aircrafts for surveillance. However, the measure does not currently include an exception allowing for the use of unmanned aircraft for routine patrol in remote and inaccessible geographic locations. The Department respectfully requests language be inserted in the bill that would allow for the Department to use unmanned aircraft to patrol these remote areas of state land. For that matter, the Department asks the Committees' consideration to include resource management as an acceptable use for unmanned aircrafts to assist the Department in protecting and managing Hawaii's unique and limited natural, cultural, and historic resources.

# TESTIMONY OPPOSING SENATE BILL 579 - RELATING TO UNMANNED AIRCRAFT TECHNOLOGY

Dear Members of the 28th Hawaii State Legislature,

I am writing in opposition of this bill, the intent of which is to "...ensure that unmanned aircraft technology is used strictly to assist or benefit Hawaii residents and not used in a manner that will impede their right to privacy."

SB 579 restricts the use of unmanned aircraft for surveillance by law enforcement to only those "exceptions" that are defined in the bill. If there is anything we have learned about technology, it is that new uses are discovered every day. Traffic management, accident investigation, and crowd control come immediately to mind, but would be prohibited under its provisions.

First, a question. Would we apply these same rules to manned aircraft, such as our police helicopters and other manned aircraft operated by state government agencies?

A much better approach to protect individual rights to privacy would be to define what law enforcement (or any state government agency for that matter) cannot do.

I suggest we draw upon on material developed by the Association of Aerospace States, which can ensure our privacy while allowing state government agencies to leverage the technology to save money and better serve the public. Consider the following:

- Require a warrant for government surveillance of an individual or their property where the individual is specifically targeted for surveillance in advance without their permission. All other observation activities should not require a warrant, to the extent allowed under Supreme Court rulings.
- Prohibit the repurposing of data collected from Government use of UAS in warrantless observation unless a warrant allows the repurposing.
- Prohibit unmanned aircraft from tracking specific, identifiable individuals without their consent.
- Prohibit weapons carriage on unmanned systems.

It should also be understood, and perhaps emphasized in any legislation being considered, that existing laws regarding individual privacy, peeping toms, nuisances, trespassing, etc. apply to the operation of unmanned systems.

The reporting requirements levied in this bill are extremely cumbersome and expensive to comply with, and I look forward to hearing from our law enforcement officials about that.
