I'm Debbie Anderson, a teacher of linguistically diverse students on the Big Island at Waiakea Intermediate School. As a member of the NEA EL Cadre, I'm a staunch supporter of language learners and the beneficial skills of multiple language development. We urge you to pass SCR 115 in support of adding world language options in our ever increase diverse world.
