The Department of Transportation (DOT) is providing **comments** regarding Senate Concurrent Resolution 137 urging appropriate state and county agencies to collaborate to issue multi-designation special license plates to persons who qualify for more than one special license plate.

License plates and special license plate responsibilities are handled by the counties' Director of Finance in accordance with Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS). Section 249-9.3 (a), HRS, reads as follows:

"In lieu of the number plates contracted on behalf of the counties by the director of finance of the city and county of Honolulu, the county directors of finance shall issue special number plates to any organization in the State that meets the minimum standards and qualifications established under this section. Organizations are authorized to retain the fees collected, less expenses, for the special number plates.

The director of finance of the city and county of Honolulu, in consultation with the directors of finance of the counties of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii, shall establish special design parameters and restrictions for decals or graphic representations affixable to special number plates; provided that the decal shall not be larger than three inches wide by three inches high."

Therefore, the Department of Transportation respectfully requests that the Director of Transportation be removed from the collaborative group.

The Disability and Communication Access Board (DCAB) takes no position but offers comments on this measure Senate Concurrent Resolution 137 Urging Appropriate State and County Agencies to Collaborate to Issue Multi-Designation Special License Plates to Persons who Qualify for More Than One Special License Plate.

Under Section 291 Part III, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) Title 11, Chapter 219 eligibility IS delineated for qualifications for a parking permit for persons with disabilities.
