I. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

Description of Wai'anae Coast Community Foundation (WCCF).

History:

Our mission is to enhance the educational, cultural and to provide and operate as an educational organization that develops, promotes, sponsors and/or facilitates programs with events promoting implementing and/or participation social and athletic activities in supporting community based and environmentally related initiatives programs along the plains of West O'ahu, Hawaii to the Wai'anae Coast. Special consideration is given for those program and activities that included those who are enduring economically challenged life circumstances. The organization organized in 2014 and in 2015 as the 501 © 3 non-profit organization "Wai'anae Coast Community Foundation. (WCCF)

Plans include: Through the years, WCCF has invested in significant planning to nurture the community's vision and explore how to best manage our ahupua'a. Our plans have included several programs and community service projects:

(A) **All Star After-School Program** - to assist with their sports, cultural, educational or school related activity. WCCF, in 2015, has funded the program by providing the Intermediate after school football program for Nanakuli Inter. and Ka Waihona Charter School students (50), with uniforms, coaches, daily practices, transportation and focusing on the importance of higher education with guest speakers, focusing on team building, clean up beautifications in their community and to be positive role models and preparation of college planning and to achieving their goals in life. WCCF has played an active role in bringing this after school program back along with community volunteer coaches to support a daily healthy sport for our young boys and girls. WCCF also was responsible to obtain all funding for this program and provided transportation, uniforms, equipment and after school activity.

(B) **Boys and Girls Club - Nanakuli** - the goal of this program is to provide an after-school sports program for ages from 4th, 5th, 6 graders from three Elementary Schools located in Nanakuli. i.e. Nanaikapono, Nanakuli, Kai Waihona Charter School in collaboration with the Boys and Girls Program. WCCF coaches provide and prepare students to exercise, good eating habits and participate in our Hawaii State Jr. Prep Football League. WCCF has fund the entire program as well as the tuition assistance for each player/student.

(C) **Toys for Tots Program** - WCCF a nonprofit organization serving island wide communities in this program, is the organization that collects, approves all toys from the US Marines and oversees sorting and distributing of gifts through this program. Each year tens of thousands of children receive new gifts because of this program and the efforts of service agencies through our State of Hawai'i. It is so important for us to be fair as possible as well as for us to stick with the purpose of this program, to help all our children in need. Our program service children with special needs such as chronic medical conditions, victims of domestic violence and in shelters.

(D) **Community Food Bank Distributor** - WCCF participates in a monthly food distribution to the community of Wai'anae. The program distributes every 2nd Thursday on site from 12 noon to 2 pm to anyone in need with a current photo ID. WCCF also delivers boxes prepared for the senior facility located in Nanakuli, Homes in Hawaii Housing Authority and to the beach areas for our homeless families.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

Our goal for the All Star-After School program is to build and strengthen our students, this year in 2015, the program for ASAS Intermediate Football program was discontinued. WCCF now have made this free, comprehensive after-school experience time study and fun by engaging in activities. It provides after school learning opportunities for middle school youths and fitness. Our coaches all coach daily to the students for free and no charge for any student to enter the football program. WCCF is committed to giving our kids access to a safe and engaging environment non-school hours, to participate in fiscal fitness conditioning and weekends football games against other Middle schools across O'ahu.

The Toys for Tots Program is a 31-year program in O'ahu, and WCCF is committed to carry out the large task of serving over 220 service providers along with 178 churches, other organizations and individual families of need across O'ahu. The Salvation Army organization for many years have worked with the US Marines but has handed this program to WCCF to plan, coordinated, distribute and fund raise. Without any funding obtain a small portion of sponsor support for our program. In this role, WCCF board has volunteered many long hours through the week and weekends to fully support the distribution of toys that are delivered by the US Marines. WCCF, has done this on a volunteering bases and our goal is to instill the importance of continuing this charitable program. September, October, November and December each year, and distribute those toys as Christmas gifts to less fortunate children in the community in which the campaign is conducted. WCCF primary goal of Toys for Tots is to deliver,

through a new toy at Christmas, a message of hope to less fortunate youngsters that will assist them in becoming responsible, productive, patriotic citizens.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

Toys for Tots is a Top-Rated Charity over 97% of your donation goes to our mission statement in providing toys, books and other gifts to less fortunate children. Less than 3% is spent on fundraising and overhead.

In 1995, the Secretary of Defense approved Toys for Tots as an official of the US Marine Corps and an official mission of the Marine Corps Reserve. In 1996, it expanded to cover all 50 states and selected local community organizations and throughout the years and rank as a Charity Navigator and Outstanding organization of the Year.

Over the life span, the Marine Toys for Tots Program distributed over 494 million toys to over 230 million less fortunate. The Salvation Army staff was the force agency to collect and distribute all the toys collected from the US Marines, in 2014 The Salvation Army has directed this mission to the Wai'anae Coast Community Foundation. (WCCF)

In the months of September, October, November and December 2015, the distribution of those toys as Christmas gifts to less fortunate children in the community in which the campaign is conducted. WCCF primary goal of Toys for Tots is to deliver, through a new toy at Christmas, a message of hope to less fortunate youngsters that will assist them in becoming responsible, productive, patriotic citizens.

4. Describe the target population to be served;

The target population from this Toys for Tots Program distributes over 40,000 to the less fortunate. **In Hawaii, we have delivered over 23,600 toys and over 220 service providers, churches and families of need across the island of O'ahu.**

Should funding be provided, the WCCF intends to use such funds to accomplish the following:

***Operate the All-Star After School Intermediate Sports Program** for the students that attend the Nanakuli Intermediate School and Kai Waihona Charter Public School; * Continuing education and training for our Intermediate school athletic coaches, students through free clinics, workshops, and seminars, which includes awareness education as required by state law under Act 197, signed into law 2012. (All our coaches are volunteers to the program)

***Boys and Girls Club Nanakuli After School Sports Program** for students from 4th, 5th, 6 grade levels. WCCF provides a safe healthy program and a level of development for future sports football in Inter and High School. WCCF currently work closely with the Boys and Girls Club in providing the same curricular sports program from Monday to Friday from 4:00 to 5:30 on the grounds of Nanaikapono Elementary School. (All our coaches are volunteers to the program)

*** Toys for Tots Program** yearly through the holiday, the program is in need to purchase equipment to maintain serving all our service providers and that WCCF can fully assist in the distribution of toys to all our needy children. WCCF, will use the funding only for the program and the need of proper equipment i.e. forklift, delivery vehicle, rental warehouse space, supplies.

The Toys for Tots has earned the distinction as a program which plays an important role in helping youngsters emerge from a background of poverty to adulthood as assets to society. Toys for Tots not only benefits children, but also has a positive impact on communities, on business - large and small on the Marine Corp and on the Nation. Toys for Tots is one vehicle of addressing the issue of poverty among children.

Community Outreach Food Distribution Program – WCCF has develop a strong relationship with the community of the Wai’anae Coast. As a high poor unemployment community, many have struggled with feeding their families and children. WCCF provides food distribution every 2nd Thursday of the month to the many that requires this assistance. As their food stamp gets low and many along the beaches, food is an important necessity for people who resides and struggle along the Wai’anae Coast. Currently, we serve from 120 – 160 people who resides along the Coast or homeless.

WCCF has earned the distinction as a program which plays an important role in helping youngsters emerge from a background of poverty to adulthood as assets to society. Toys for Tots not only benefits children, but also has a positive impact on communities, on business - large and small on the Marine Corp and on the Nation. Toys for Tots is one vehicle of addressing the issue of poverty among children.

3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results; and

For the All Star After School Program a statistical data is regularly conducted on the amount of athletic participation by our high school. Also, evaluation meetings are routinely held after each sport season to discuss ways in which to improve our student-athlete's experience.

WCCF could satisfy the need requirement by the US Marine and The Salvation Army when this program was handed down to the WCCF members and volunteers that WCCF has for this program. WCCF could enable individual and corporate donors to Toys for Tots to take a charitable deduction on their income tax returns, operates in compliance with IRS regulations, state laws and regulations and charitable standards. Finally, WCCF took responsibility for the day to day operations of the Toys for Tots Program to work with volunteers of disability, former incarcerated men/women clean and sober home individuals of the community, college attendees to receive credits to do community services in the community, High School project graduation students, businesses and elected officials from our community.

If we receive any grant monies from the GIA grant program it will initially be used to fund all our program needs for equipment to be used for our programs. No request of operating funds to be paid for staff as we are all volunteers and members on the board has their own jobs and employment during the week and weekends at times. WCCF staff promotes a strong volunteer group and volunteers after their regular jobs and weekends are times WCCF members will dedicate their time and efforts into the programs.

Currently, no equipment is subsidized for the Toys for Tots Program from the US Marines, WCCF has rented equipment and all use their own vehicles to pick up the many toys to the warehouse. Our vehicles are not large enough to pick up large loads from major store outlets. Funds will be allocated to purchase a reasonable van for the program along with a forklift to be used to lift the crates of toys. The grant monies will be tracked by our board and will be allocated to purchase affordable equipment that is so needed to make this program a success every year to the island wide program.

Currently, we are a qualified agency to distribute Food Bank service to the community. Our distribution dates are the 2nd Thursday of each month at our site, from 12 noon to 2 pm FREE to the community in need.

WCCF financial statements and fiscal accounting area done each year with integrity.

The President, Patricia A. Teruya (Patty), has been very involved in the community of Wai'anae Coast and many community volunteer projects throughout the years. As a community leader, and serving on the Nanakuli-Mail Neighborhood Board for over 21 years elected, she serves as the Planning and Zoning Committee Chair, Board Secretary for the Nanakuli-Mail Neighborhood Board and the former Chair. She has done many several fundraisings for the Nanakuli High School Athletic programs to assist the students with new uniforms and equipment yearly, beautification parks/beach clean ups and community events. Her dedication to make the Toys for Tots program for O'ahu to be successful and continue to serve the many needy children across the island. As the project manager to WCCF Food Bank distribution program to the community of Wai'anae Coast. Her strong commitment and dedication to serving her community and island wide.

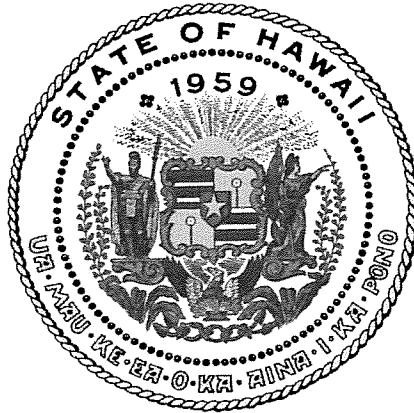

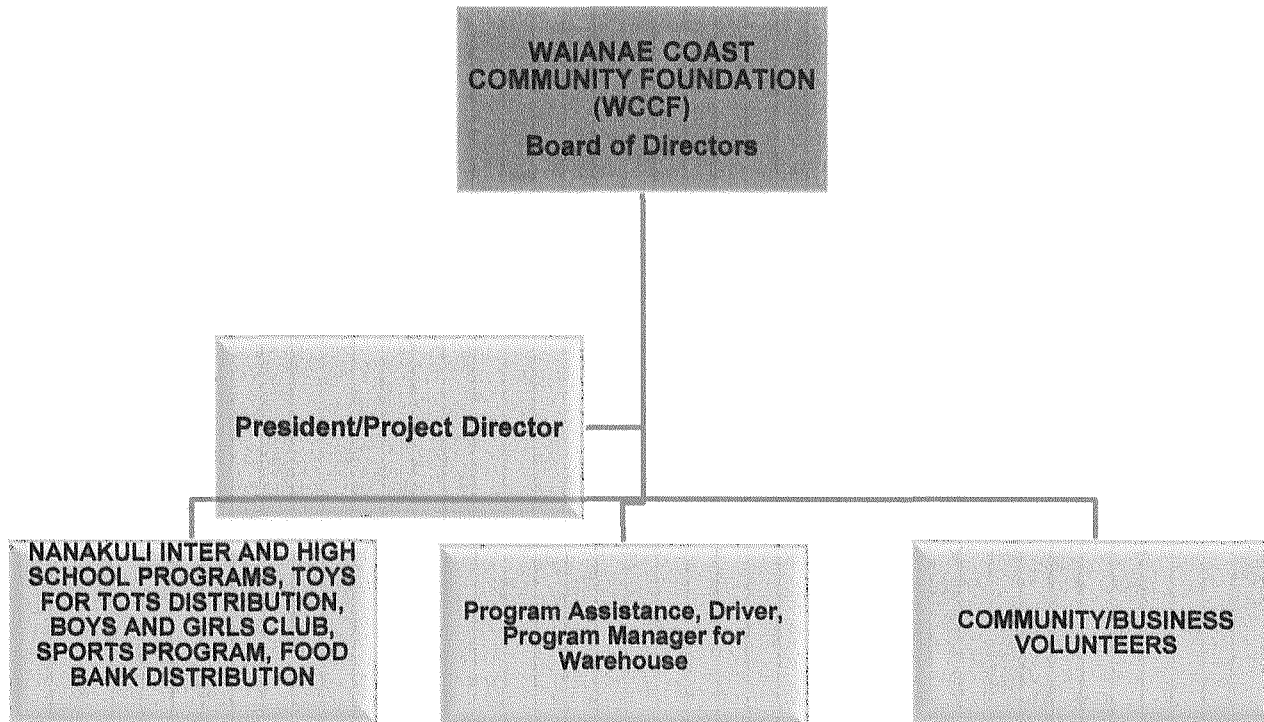

 - a) Is licensed or accredited, in accordance with federal, state, or county statutes, rules, or ordinances, to conduct the activities or provide the services for which a grant is awarded;
 - b) Complies with all applicable federal and state laws prohibiting discrimination against any person on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, or disability;
 - c) Agrees not to use state funds for entertainment or lobbying activities; and
 - d) Allows the state agency to which funds for the grant were appropriated for expenditure, legislative committees and their staff, and the auditor full access to their records, reports, files, and other related documents and information for purposes of monitoring, measuring the effectiveness, and ensuring the proper expenditure of the grant.
- 2) If the applicant is an organization, the applicant meets the following requirements pursuant to Section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes:
 - a) Is incorporated under the laws of the State; and
 - b) Has bylaws or policies that describe the manner in which the activities or services for which a grant is awarded shall be conducted or provided.
- 3) If the applicant is a non-profit organization, it meets the following requirements pursuant to Section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes:
 - a) Is determined and designated to be a non-profit organization by the Internal Revenue Service; and
 - b) Has a governing board whose members have no material conflict of interest and serve without compensation.

Pursuant to Section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for grants used for the acquisition of land, when the organization discontinues the activities or services on the land acquired for which the grant was awarded and disposes of the land in fee simple or by lease, the organization shall negotiate with the expending agency for a lump sum or installment repayment to the State of the amount of the grant used for the acquisition of the land.

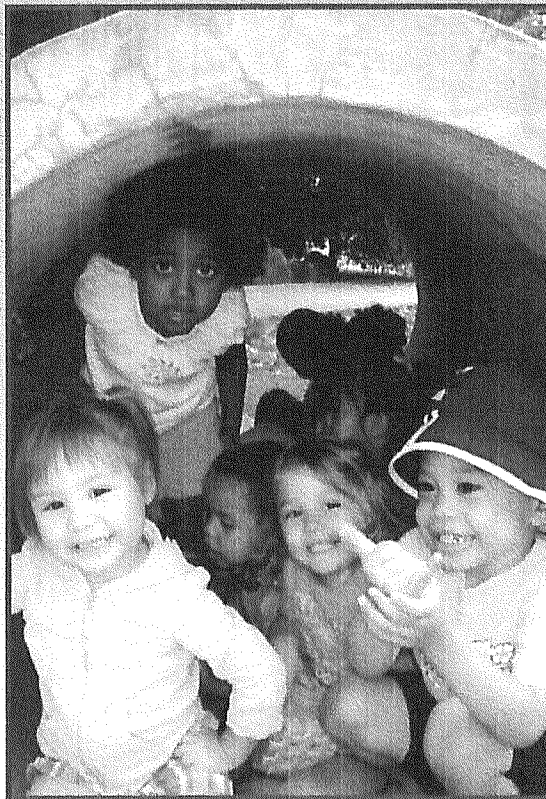

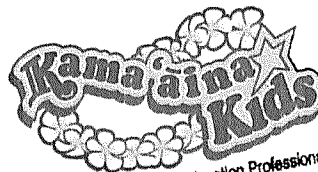
