A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEAT ABATEMENT.

	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:
1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that \$100,000,000 was
2	appropriated for the department of education's heat abatement
3	program in 2016. To advance Hawaii's clean energy goals, the
4	legislature also required the department of education to
5	establish a goal of being net-zero with respect to energy use by
6	January 1, 2035. The legislature further required the
7	department, and any contractor hired to implement classroom
8	cooling measures by the department, to maximize energy
9	efficiency, installation, and operating cost savings over the
10	entire life of heat abatement projects.
11	The legislature additionally finds that while \$100,000,000
12	was intended to fund heat abatement upgrades for at least one
13	thousand public school classrooms, an estimated six thousand
14	additional classrooms are in need of heat abatement

improvements. With contractors bidding in excess of \$80,000 per

- 3 The purpose of this Act is to expedite and enable the
- 4 cooling of all public school classrooms to a temperature
- 5 conducive to student learning by implementing energy efficiency
- 6 measures to substantially reduce energy consumption and lower kW
- 7 load, which may allow classrooms earmarked for the "cool the
- 8 schools" initiative to install air conditioners without
- 9 requiring expensive and time consuming electrical upgrades,
- 10 while reducing energy expenses for the department of education,
- 11 which will increase the availability of state funds for other
- 12 investments in education or related programs or to help offset
- 13 the additional expected kW consumption of air conditioners.
- 14 This Act provides that moneys in the Hawaii green infrastructure
- 15 special fund may be used for loans to finance the installation
- 16 costs for energy-efficient lighting and other energy-efficiency
- 17 measures related to heat abatement at public schools.
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 196-65, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

4	(1)	Making green infrastructure loans[+], including for

16	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii green
17	infrastru	cture special fund the sum of \$46,400,000 or so much
18	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 for the
19	purpose o	f financing the installation costs for energy-efficient
20	lighting	and other energy efficiency measures related to heat
21	abatement	at public schools.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii green
- 2 infrastructure authority for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. The department of education, with the approval
- 4 of the governor, is authorized to borrow the sum of \$46,400,000
- 5 or much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018
- 6 from the green infrastructure loan program for the purposes of
- 7 this Act upon such terms and conditions as are agreed to between
- 8 the department of education and the Hawaii green infrastructure
- 9 authority; provided that the loan shall be issued free of
- 10 interest charges.
- 11 SECTION 5. The department of education shall submit an
- 12 expenditure plan to the Hawaii green infrastructure authority
- 13 executive director, who shall serve as the fiscal administrator
- 14 for the loan issued pursuant to section 4 and may make payment
- 15 on behalf of the department of education, as appropriate, upon
- 16 submission of requests for payment from the department of
- 17 education.
- 18 SECTION 6. Beginning with fiscal year 2017-2018, the
- 19 department of education shall begin to repay the loan pursuant
- 20 to section 4 using general revenue savings resulting from

- reduced utility costs as a result of the implementation of 1
- 2 energy efficient lighting and other energy efficiency measures.
- 3 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
