## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I. GENERAL PROVISIONS
2	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This Act shall be known and may
3	be cited as the Office of Hawaiian Affairs Appropriations Act of
4	2017.
5	SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. Unless otherwise clear from the
6	context, as used in this Act:
7	"Means of financing" or "MOF" means the source from which
8	funds are appropriated or authorized to be expended for the
9	programs and projects specified in this Act. All appropriations
10	are followed by letter symbols. Such letter symbols, where
11	used, shall have the following meanings:
12	A general funds
13	T trust funds
14	"Position ceiling" means the maximum number of permanent
15	and temporary full-time equivalent positions authorized for a
16	particular program during a specified period or periods, as
17	denoted by an asterisk for permanent full-time equivalent

- 1 positions and a pound sign for temporary full-time equivalent
- 2 positions.
- 3 "Program ID" means the unique identifier for the specific
- 4 program and consists of the abbreviation for the Office of
- 5 Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) followed by the organization number for
- 6 the program.

#### 7 PART II. PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

- 8 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS. The following sums, or so much
- 9 thereof as may be sufficient to accomplish the purposes and
- 10 programs designated herein, are hereby appropriated or
- 11 authorized from the means of financing specified to the Office
- 12 of Hawaiian Affairs for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1,
- 13 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The total expenditures and the
- 14 number of permanent and temporary full-time equivalent positions
- 15 established in each fiscal year of the biennium shall not exceed
- 16 the sums and the position ceilings indicated for each fiscal
- 17 year, except as provided elsewhere in this Act or as provided by
- 18 general law.

- 3 in part II of this Act shall be expended by the Office of
- 4 Hawaiian Affairs.
- 5 SECTION 5. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 6 beneficiary advocacy (OHA175), the sum of \$415,000 in general
- 7 funds and \$415,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 8 the same sums for fiscal year 2018-2019 shall be expended to
- 9 provide for social services, including referral services and
- 10 case management, to at-risk Office of Hawaiian Affairs
- 11 beneficiaries to immediately address unexpected crises; provided

- 19 SECTION 6. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 20 beneficiary advocacy (OHA175), the sum of \$615,000 in general
- 21 funds and \$615,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2017-2018 and

- 1 the same sums for fiscal year 2018-2019 shall be expended to
- 2 provide for educational improvement programs for Native Hawaiian
- 3 students; provided further that program activities shall be
- 4 designed to help Native Hawaiian students meet or exceed
- 5 educational standards; and provided further that notwithstanding
- 6 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any expenditures for
- 7 the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with chapter
- 8 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or a competitive grants
- 9 process, as appropriate.
- 10 SECTION 7. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 11 beneficiary advocacy (OHA175), the sum of \$524,400 in general
- 12 funds and \$524,400 in trust funds for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 13 the same sums for fiscal year 2018-2019 shall be expended to
- 14 provide for legal services and legal representation to Office of
- 15 Hawaiian Affairs beneficiaries for:
- 16 (1) The assertion and defense of quiet title actions;
- 17 (2) Assistance with ahupua'a and kuleana tenant rights,
- including rights of access and rights to water;
- 19 (3) Land title assistance, including review of title and
- genealogy;
- 21 (4) Preservation of traditional and customary practices;

- 8 PART IV. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS AND EFFECTIVE DATE
- 9 SECTION 8. Provided that whenever necessary, the board of
- 10 trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs or the board's
- 11 designee may transfer sufficient funds and positions between
- 12 programs for operating purposes; provided further that these
- 13 transfers shall be consistent with legislative intent; and
- 14 provided further that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs shall
- 15 submit a report to the legislature of all uses of this authority
- 16 for the previous twelve month period from December 1 to November
- 17 30, no later than twenty days prior to the regular sessions of
- 18 2018 and 2019.
- 19 SECTION 9. If any portion of this Act or its application
- 20 to any person, entity, or circumstance is held to be invalid for
- 21 any reason, the legislature declares that the remainder of the
- 22 Act and each and every other provision thereof shall not be
- 23 affected thereby. If any portion of a specific appropriation is

- 1 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
- 2 be expended to fulfill the objective of such appropriation to
- 3 the extent possible.
- 4 SECTION 10. If manifest clerical, typographical, or other
- 5 mechanical errors are found in this Act, the board of trustees
- 6 of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs is authorized to correct these
- 7 errors. All changes made pursuant to this section shall be
- 8 reported to the legislature at its next session.
- 9 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
