# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ASSISTING DAM AND RESERVOIR OWNERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 39A-341, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended as follows:
3	1. By amending the definition of "appurtenant works" to

12	""Dam" [shall have the same meaning in this part as it has
13	in section 179D-3.] means any artificial barrier, including
14	appurtenant works, that impounds or diverts water and that:
15	(1) Is twenty-five feet or more in height from the natural
16	bed of the stream or watercourse measured at the
