STATE OF HAWAII

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STAFF OF THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii employerunion health benefits trust fund (EUTF) would operationally 2 3 benefit from employing certain EUTF staff through the civil service system. The purpose of this Act is to permit the EUTF 4 5 to employ certain EUTF staff through the civil service system. SECTION 2. Section 87A-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 7 amended to read as follows: 8 "\$87A-24 Other powers. In addition to the power to 9 administer the fund, the board may: (1)
- 10 Collect, receive, deposit, and withdraw money on 11 behalf of the fund;
- 12 (2) Invest moneys in the same manner specified in section 13 88-119;
- Hold, purchase, sell, assign, transfer, or dispose of 14 (3) 15 any securities or other investments of the fund, as 16 well as the proceeds of those investments and any 17 money belonging to the fund;

Ţ	(4)	Appoint, and at pleasure dismiss, an administrator and
2		other fund staff. The administrator [and staff] shall
3		be exempt from chapter 76 [and]. Other fund staff may
4		be exempt from chapter 76 as determined by the board.
5		The administrator and staff who are exempt from
6		chapter 76 shall serve under and at the pleasure of
7		the board; provided that civil service exempt
8		positions under this section that are created after
9		July 1, 2014, shall be exempt from section

19		this chapter, including the retaining of an actuary to
20		determine the annual required public employer

1		contribution for the separate trust fund established	
2		under section 87A-42;	
3	(8)	Establish health benefits plan and long-term care	
4		benefits plan rates that include administrative and	
5		other expenses necessary to effectuate the purposes of	
6		the fund; and	
7	(9)	Require any department, agency, or employee of the	
8		State or counties to furnish information to the board	
9		to carry out the purposes of this chapter."	
10	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii		
11	employer-union health benefits trust fund the sum of \$86,837 or		
12	so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018		
13	and the sum of \$104,616 or so much thereof as may be necessary		
14	for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the Hawaii employer-union health		
15	benefits trust fund to employ certain Hawaii employer-union		
16	health benefits trust fund staff through the civil service		
17	system.		
18	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii	
19	employer-union health benefits trust fund for the purposes of		
20	this Act.		

- 1 SECTION 4. The Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust
- 2 fund shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations,
- 3 including any proposed legislation, regarding changes to its
- 4 personnel and operations as a result of this Act, to the
- 5 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 6 the regular sessions of 2018 and 2019.
- 7 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
