A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FUNDING FOR CREATIVE MEDIA AND FILM DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Hawaii's film industry brings in an estimated
- 2 \$250,000,000 in production revenues per year, providing the
- 3 State with an estimated economic impact of \$437,000,000
- 4 annually. Hawaii must keep pace to support the new platforms of
- 5 creative media, which require purpose-built or renovated
- 6 facilities in order to support these expanding sectors.
- 7 According to the Motion Picture Association of America, the
- 8 entertainment industry in the United States is comprised of
- 9 108,000 businesses and represents \$104,000,000,000 in total job
- 10 wages across all fifty states and includes film, television, and
- 11 digital or creative media sectors. Hawaii is well-positioned to
- 12 compete in the global entertainment industry arena, but must
- 13 explore ways in which to leverage current and future
- 14 infrastructure assets to self-fund maintenance of existing and
- 15 future facilities.
- 16 The Hawaii film office in the creative industries division
- 17 of the department of business, economic development, and tourism



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- 1 is involved in all aspects of the film industry, including
- 2 fulfilling its statutory duties for film permitting, tax
- 3 incentive management, and studio operations and management.
- 4 With the passage of Act 88, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006 and
- 5 Act 89, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, which included enhancements
- 6 to the motion picture, digital media, and film production income
- 7 tax credit program, the demands on the Hawaii film office's
- 8 responsibilities increased. Without a provision in the measure
- 9 to provide additional professional staff to manage the multi-
- 10 million dollar program, the film office has been handling all
- 11 aspects of the credit with limited staff and resources that are
- 12 stretched to capacity. While two positions and a percentage of
- 13 the base funding have been restored, the costs to offer
- 14 facilitation for productions, manage the motion picture, digital
- 15 media, and film production income tax credit program, and
- 16 maintain the Hawaii film studio far exceed the existing general
- 17 fund allocations of funding and staffing.
- 18 This Act broadens the sources of revenue for and renames
- 19 the special fund created in section 201-113, Hawaii Revised
- 20 Statutes. By capturing revenues from the Hawaii film studio and
- 21 other potential revenue sources such as grants, the special fund

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- 1 will provide a necessary funding mechanism for ongoing basic
- 2 repair and maintenance of the Hawaii film studio, which average
- 3 \$150,000 per year, as well other new infrastructure to support
- 4 the creative media and film industries. With anticipated gross
- 5 revenues generated by current film studio rental of \$600,000
- 6 annually, the department of business, economic development, and
- 7 tourism will have the means to maintain the studio facility and
- 8 related infrastructure that it currently is unable to do.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by amending the title of part IX to read as follows:
- 12 [DEVELOPMENT] INFRASTRUCTURE SPECIAL FUND"
- 13 SECTION 3. Section 201-113, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:

15	(b)	The fund shall be used by the [board to assist in, and	
16	provide i	ncentives for, the production of eligible Hawaii	
17	projects	that are in compliance with criteria and standards	
18	establish	ed by the board in accordance with rules adopted by the	
19	board pursuant to chapter 91. In particular, the board shall		
20	adopt rules to provide for the implementation of the following		
21	programs:		

1	(1)	A gr	ant program. The board shall adopt rules pursuant
2		to c	hapter 91 to provide conditions and qualifications
3		for	grants. Applications for grants shall be made to
4		the	board and shall contain such information as the
5		boar	d shall require by rules adopted pursuant to
6		chap	ter 91. At a minimum, the applicant shall agree
7		to t	he following conditions:
8		(A)	The grant shall be used exclusively for eligible
9			Hawaii projects;
10		-(B) -	The applicant shall have applied for or received
11			all applicable licenses and permits;
12		(C)	The applicant shall comply with applicable
13			federal and state laws prohibiting discrimination
14			against any person on the basis of race, color,
15			national origin, religion, creed, sex, age, or
16			physical handicap;
17		(D)	The applicant shall comply with other
18			requirements as the board may prescribe;
19		(E)	All activities undertaken with funds received
20			shall comply with all applicable federal, state,
21			and county statutes and ordinances;

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1		(F)	The applicant shall indemnify and save harmless
2			the State of Hawaii and its officers, agents, and
3			employees from and against any and all claims
4			arising out of or resulting from activities
5			carried out or projects undertaken with funds
6			provided hereunder, and procure sufficient
7			insurance to provide this indemnification if
8			requested to do so by the department;
9		(G)	The applicant shall make available to the board
10			all records the applicant may have relating to
11			the project, to allow the board to monitor the
12			applicant's compliance with the purpose of this
13			chapter; and
14		(H)	The applicant, to the satisfaction of the board,
15			shall establish that sufficient funds are
16			available for the completion of the project for
17			the purpose for which the grant is awarded; and
18	(2)	A ve	nture capital program. The board shall adopt
19		rule	s pursuant to chapter 91 to provide conditions and
20		qual	ifications for venture capital investments in
21		elig	ible Hawaii projects. The program may include a

1		written agreement between the borrower and the board,
2		as the representative of the State, that as
3		consideration for the venture capital investment made
4		under this part, the borrower shall share any
5		royalties, licenses, titles, rights, or any other
6		monetary benefits that may accrue to the borrower
7		pursuant to terms and conditions established by the
8		board by rule pursuant to chapter 91. Venture capital
9		investments may be made on such terms and conditions
10		as the board shall determine to be reasonable,
11		appropriate, and consistent with the purposes and
12		objectives of this part. department of business,
13	economic	development, and tourism to provide for:
14	(1)	Operations, repair, and maintenance of the Hawaii film
15		studio;
16	(2)	Support for new infrastructure development;
17	(3)	Programs and initiatives for creative media industry

1 SECTION 4. Section 201-111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 repealed. 3 ["[\$201-111] Definitions. As used in this part: 4 "Applicant" means a person applying for a grant or venture 5 capital investment from the board under this part. "Board" means the Hawaii television and film development 6 7 board. 8 "Eligible Hawaii project" or "project" means an 9 entertainment project in which at least seventy five per cent of 10 the budget for the production costs, excluding salaries and 11 costs for the producer, director, writer, screenplay, and actors 12 in the project, is dedicated for the purchase or lease of goods 13 or services from a vendor or supplier who is located and doing 14 business in the State. 15 "Fund" means the Hawaii television and film development 16 special fund. 17 "Venture capital investment" means any of the following 18 investments in a project: 19 (1) Common or preferred stock and equity securities 20 without a repurchase requirement for at least five 21 years;

1	(2)	A right to purchase stock or equity securities;		
2	(3)	Any debenture, whether or not convertible or having		
3		stock purchase rights, which is subordinated, together		
4		with security interests against the assets of the

13	(a) There is established the Hawaii television and film			
14	developme	ent board. The board shall be attached to the		
15	departmen	t of business, economic development, and tourism for		
16	administr	cative purposes only. The board shall administer the		
17	grant and	l venture capital investment programs and the Hawaii		
18	televisio	on and film development special fund established under		
19	this part	. The board shall also assess and consider the overall		
20	viability	and development of the television and film industries		

1 and make recommendations to appropriate state or county 2 agencies. 3 (b) The board shall be composed of nine members, four of 4 whom shall be appointed by the governor pursuant to section 26-5 34, and all of whom shall serve four-year staggered terms. One 6 of the governor's appointments shall be made from a list of 7 nominees submitted by the president of the senate and another 8 appointment shall be made from a list of nominees submitted by 9 the speaker of the house of representatives. The four appointed 10 members shall possess a current working knowledge of the film, 11 television, or entertainment industry.
