### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE AUTHORITY TO ADJUST PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING FEES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 92-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§92-28 State service fees; increase or decrease of. Any 4 law to the contrary notwithstanding, the fees or other nontax 5 revenues assessed or charged by any board, commission, or other 6 governmental agency may be increased or decreased by the body in 7 an amount not to exceed fifty per cent of the statutorily 8 assessed fee or nontax revenue, to maintain a reasonable 9 relation between the revenues derived from such fee or nontax 10 revenue and the cost or value of services rendered, 11 comparability among fees imposed by the State, or any other 12 purpose which it may deem necessary and reasonable; provided 13 that: 14 (1)The authority to increase or decrease fees or nontax 15 revenues shall be subject to the approval of the 16 governor and extend only to the following: chapters 17 36, 92, 94, 142, 144, 145, 147, 150, 171, 188, 189,

#### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Commerce and Consumer Affairs

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE AUTHORITY TO ADJUST PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING FEES.

PURPOSE: To provide the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' (DCCA) Professional and Vocational Licensing Division (PVLD) with the flexibility to decrease or increase fees in a timely manner, subject to the approval of the Governor. Specifically, this measure amends section 92-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), by extending the authority to adjust licensing fees to six licensing laws (chapters 436H, 440E, 465D, 466D, 472, and 481E, HRS), and by adding language to allow for the automatic inclusion of all future licensing regulatory areas specifically and statutorily assigned to the DCCA pursuant to title 25, HRS.

MEANS: Amend section 92-28, HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: Section 92-28, HRS, was last updated in 2007. Since then, six new licensing areas have been added to the PVLD for regulation. The six areas are Athletic Trainers, Behavior Analysts, Mixed Martial Arts, Respiratory Therapists, Uniform Athlete Agents, and Veterinary Technicians. This measure also updates section 92-28, HRS, to include language that will allow for the automatic inclusion of any new PVLD licensing laws or other laws creating boards, commissions, or programs within DCCA pursuant to title 25, HRS. To ensure that all of PVLD's licensing areas are treated fairly and impartially, the amendments to the bill are essential, in order to timely decrease or increase fees, subject to the approval of the Governor.

<u>Impact on the public:</u> Minimal impact on the public is expected.

Impact on the department and other agencies: The impact on PVLD will be positive as PVLD will be able to more timely respond to changing economic conditions by offering discounts to all of its licensing areas, when and if PVLD is fiscally able to do so.

It is not anticipated that this bill will impact other governmental agencies.
