A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE AUTHORITY TO ADJUST PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL LICENSING FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 92-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§92-28 State service fees; increase or decrease of. Any 4 law to the contrary notwithstanding, the fees, including special 5 assessments, or other nontax revenues assessed or charged by any 6 board, commission, or other governmental agency may be increased 7 or decreased by the body in an amount not to exceed fifty per 8 cent of the statutorily assessed fee or nontax revenue, to 9 maintain a reasonable relation between the revenues derived from 10 such fee, including special assessment, or nontax revenue and 11 the cost or value of services rendered, comparability among fees

12 imposed by the State, or any other purpose which it may deem 13 necessary and reasonable; provided that:

14 (1) The authority to increase or decrease fees, including
15 <u>special assessment</u>, or nontax revenues shall be
16 subject to the approval of the governor and extend

1 The authority to increase or decrease fees, including (3) 2 special assessments, or nontax revenues established by 3 the University of Hawaii under chapter 304A shall be 4 subject to the approval of the board of regents; 5 provided that the board's approval of any increase or 6 decrease in tuition for regular credit courses shall 7 be preceded by an open public meeting held during or 8 prior to the semester preceding the semester to which 9 the tuition applies; 10 (4)This section shall not apply to judicial fees as may 11 be set by any chapter cited in this section; 12 (5) The authority to increase or decrease fees, including 13 special assessments, or nontax revenues pursuant to 14 this section shall be exempt from the public notice 15 and public hearing requirements of chapter 91; and 16 Fees for copies of proposed and final rules and public (6) 17 notices of proposed rulemaking actions under chapter 18 91 shall not exceed 10 cents a page, as required by 19 section 91-2.5." 20 SECTION 2.
