### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOL INNOVATION GRANTS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that it is a matter of SECTION 1. 2 statewide concern to authorize public school innovation and 3 systemic school empowerment under the auspices of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA), authorized as P.L. 114-95. 4 5 ESSA offers the State of Hawaii a new opportunity to set a renewed vision of high expectations and move away from a "one 6 size fits all "approach to student learning. ESSA provides our 7 8 public school system the authority to embrace public school 9 innovation and systemic school empowerment, within a context of 10 Hawaii's unique values, beliefs, culture, history, and language. 11 The legislature further finds that there is a public 12 benefit from school-level innovation, beginning with the 13 development of exemplary leadership and elevation of the 14 teaching profession. Such exemplary leadership will reflect 15 school-level and community-based input, recognize visionary educational practices, and reward achievement of school-based 16 **17** targets. Teachers will be empowered to adopt educational

- 1 practices that support global learner outcomes based upon
- 2 individual assessments rather than standardized testing.
- 3 The board of education shall, as a matter of statewide
- 4 policy, encourage innovation in department of education schools
- 5 that support global learner outcomes and recognize cultural
- 6 context. All public schools shall be challenged to close
- 7 achievement gaps and prepare students to be successful in a new
- 8 innovation economy.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to provide authority to the
- 10 board of education to award grants to support school-level
- 11 innovations reflecting visionary and aspirational educational
- 12 practices that will result in closing student achievement gaps
- 13 and fund these grants.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
- 16 designated and to read as follows:
- 17 "§302A- Public school innovation grants program. (a)
- 18 There is established within the department of education, a
- 19 public school innovation grants program under the direction of
- 20 the board. The board shall, on an annual basis:

1	(1)	Adopt guiding principles and measures of success to
2		implement the purposes of the program;
3	(2)	Develop a request for proposals based upon the guiding
4		principles and measures of success, including a
5		schedule of proposal submission and award deadlines;
6	(3)	Ensure that information about the grant program is
7		published and broadcast via electronic media sites
8		managed by the department of education;
9	(4)	Create a grant review and awards committee composed of
10		eleven members to include the chairperson of the
11		board, a second member of the board, the student
12		member of the board, four teachers, three principals,
13		and one parent; provided that the counties of Kauai,
14		Maui, and Hawaii shall each be represented by a
15		committee member; and
16	(5)	Make awards to schools or programs that reflect the
17		board's guiding principles and that have the potential
18		for knowledge transfer within the public school
19		system.

1	(b)	Beginning with the convening of the regular session of	
2	2019, the	board shall submit to the legislature an annual report	
3	that incl	udes:	
4	(1)	A list of the schools or programs receiving the grants	
5		and the amount of each grant;	
6	(2)	A description of the innovations being supported by	
7		each grant; and	
8	(3)	The measures of success being used for each grant.

10	(a) Ther	e is established in the state treasury, the public

13	(1)	Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund;

17	(b)	Moneys in the public school innovation grants special	
18	fund shal	l be used to make awards to schools or programs that	
19	reflect t	he board's guiding principles and that have the	
20	potential	for knowledge transfer within the public school

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 302A-1101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) There shall be a principal executive department to be
- 4 known as the department of education, which shall be headed by a
- 5 policy-making board to be known as the board of education. The
- 6 board shall have power in accordance with law to formulate
- 7 statewide educational policy, adopt student performance
- 8 standards and assessment models, monitor school success,
- 9 administer the public school innovation grants program, and
- 10 appoint the superintendent of education as the chief executive
- 11 officer of the public school system."
- 12 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii, the sum of \$ or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018, for
- 15 deposit into the public school innovation grants special fund.
- 16 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the public school
- 17 innovation grants special fund the sum of \$ or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018, for the
- 19 public school innovation grants program.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 21 education for the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 2 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2051.
