TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

PURPOSE:

This bill removes the sunset provision in Act 139, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2012. 139 amended several sections of the Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) that allowed the Department of Public Safety to implement new programs, databases and procedures, utilizing evidence-based practices, with the goal of reducing recidivism. Because the sunset provision would effectively eliminate parts of several related HRS sections that enable these important programs, the Department of Public Safety and the Hawaii Paroling Authority are proposing to remove the sunset provision in order to leave intact those key areas of the statutes. The affected sections of the HRS are:

-Section 353-10; -Section 353-66(e); -Section 706-670(1); -Section 353-22.6; and -Section 353-69.

MEANS:

Amend section 14 of Act 139, SLH 2012.

JUSTIFICATION:

This bill will keep in place the provisions that were enacted related to the Justice Reinvestment Initiative to assist the Department of Public Safety and the Hawaii Paroling Authority in reducing recidivism and promoting public safety. Great strides have been made with the pretrial risk assessments, increased restitution collections for victims, and increased parole releases. The Reentry Office in Public Safety has been reopened and is now almost fully staffed, leading to greater facilitation of the transition of offenders into the community. This promising work would be halted if the sunset provision is allowed to stand.

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Impact on the public: Communities will benefit by receiving offenders who are better prepared to be contributing members of society and less likely to recidivate.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The impacts would continue to be positive, as
the Justice Reinvestment Intitiative programs
are extended and build upon past successes.
