# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELEVATOR MECHANICS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 448H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding four new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§448H-</u> Examination. (a) Every applicant for a licens
5	shall pass a licensing examination.
6	(b) In addition, every applicant for a license under
7	subsection (a) shall also:
8	(1) Pay an examination fee as provided in rules adopted b
9	the board pursuant to chapter 91;
10	(2) Pass the examination with an examination score of not
11	less than seventy per cent;
12	(3) Be disallowed from retaking an examination less than
13	three months after failing an examination; and
14	(4) Be disallowed from reviewing the applicant's answers
15	to an examination that the applicant failed to pass.
16	<b>§448H-</b> Apprentice registration. (a) All apprentices
17	shall register with the board and the department of labor and

2	apprentic	eship program or arrival in the State, whichever occurs
3	<u>earlier.</u>	Failure to register within sixty days shall constitute

The board shall also meet but not later than thirty 17 days prior to the licensing examination pursuant to section 18 448H-5(2) in order to evaluate applications therefor. Any board 19 member who misses two consecutive meetings of the board or fifty 20 per cent of the meetings in a year shall be removed from the 21 board."

4	SECTION 8. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
5	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
6	begun before its effective date.
7	SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
