# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that pharmacy benefit

2 managers are companies that are heavily involved in the pharmacy

3 industry and the process by which prescription drug benefits are

4 offered by insurance companies, including deciding what

5 prescription drugs should be included in an insurer's formulary,

setting reimbursement rates, specifying the prior authorization

process, setting copayment amounts, and establishing pharmacy

8 networks, among other things.

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9 The legislature further finds that the actions of pharmacy

benefit managers can have wide-ranging impacts on pharmacies and

11 consumers in Hawaii, particularly those consumers in rural areas

12 who may have limited access to pharmacies within a pharmacy

13 benefit manager's network. Despite these potential impacts,

pharmacy benefit managers are not currently subject to state

15 regulation and oversight.

1	Accor	dingly, the purpose of this Act is to require pharmacy	
2	benefit ma	nagers in Hawaii to register with the insurance	
3	commissioner.		
4	SECTI	ON 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by	
5	adding a new chapter to title 24 to be appropriately designated		
6	and to rea	ad as follows:

9	§ -	A Definitions. As used in this chapter:	
10	"Comm	nissioner" means the insurance commissioner.	
11	"Cove	ered entity" means:	
12	(1)	A health benefits plan regulated under chapter 87A,	
13		health insurer regulated under article 10A of chapter	
14		431, mutual benefit society regulated under article 1	
15		of chapter 432, or health maintenance organization	
16		regulated under chapter 432D;	
17	(2)	A health program administered by the State in the	
18		capacity of a provider of health coverage; or	
19	(3)	An employer, labor union, or other group of persons	
20		organized in the State that provides health coverage	
21		to covered persons employed or residing in the State.

2		prescription drug utilization;	
3	(2)	The procurement of prescription drugs by a pharmacy	
4		benefit manager at a negotiated rate for dispensation	
5		to covered persons in the State; or	
6	(3)	The administration or management of prescription drug	
7		benefits provided by a covered entity for the benefit	
8		of covered persons.	
9	"Pha	rmacy benefit manager" means any person that performs	
10	pharmacy	benefit management, including but not limited to a	
11	person or	entity in a contractual or employment relationship	
12	with a ph	armacy benefit manager to perform pharmacy benefit	
13	management for a covered entity.		
14	"Pre	scription drug benefit plan" means a health insurance	
15	plan offe	red by a covered entity that includes coverage for	
16	prescript	ion drugs.	
17	S	-B Applicability. This chapter shall apply to any	
18	pharmacy	benefit manager that provides pharmacy benefit	
19	managemen	t services to covered persons who are residents of the	
20	State.		

1	§ -C Registration required. (a) No person shall act or
2	operate as a pharmacy benefit manager without first obtaining a
3	valid registration issued by the commissioner pursuant to this
4	chapter.
5	(b) Each person seeking to register as a pharmacy benefit
6	manager shall file with the commissioner an application on a
7	form prescribed by the commissioner. The application shall
8	include:
9	(1) The name, address, official position, and professional
10	qualifications of each individual who is responsible
11	for the conduct of the affairs of the pharmacy benefit
12	manager, including all members of the board of
13	directors; board of trustees; executive commission;
14	other governing board or committee; principal
15	officers, as applicable; partners or members, as
16	applicable; and any other person who exercises control
17	or influence over the affairs of the pharmacy benefit
18	manager;
19	(2) The name and address of the applicant's agent for
20	service of process in the State; and

(3) A nonrefundable application fee of \$140.

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- 1 § -D Annual renewal requirement. (a) Each pharmacy
- 2 benefit manager shall renew its registration by March 31 each
- 3 year.
- 4 (b) When renewing its registration, a pharmacy benefit
- 5 manager shall submit to the commissioner the following:
- 6 (1) An application for renewal on a form prescribed by the
- 7 commissioner; and
- 8 (2) A renewal fee of \$140.
- 9 (c) Failure on the part of a pharmacy benefit manager to
- 10 renew its registration as provided in this section shall result
- 11 in a penalty of \$140 and may cause the registration to be
- 12 revoked or suspended by the commissioner until the requirements
- 13 for renewal have been met.
- 14 § -E Penalty. Any person who acts as a pharmacy benefit
- 15 manager in this State without first being registered pursuant to
- 16 this chapter shall be subject to a fine of \$500 for each
- 17 violation.
- 18 § -F Rules. The commissioner shall adopt, amend, or
- 19 repeal rules pursuant to chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of
- 20 this chapter."

- 1 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 3 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 4 the new sections in this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2090.
