### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that pharmacy benefit 1 2 managers are administrators of prescription drug programs and 3 are responsible for developing and maintaining formularies and 4 other clinical management programs, processing prescription drug 5 claims for insurance companies or corporations, and negotiating 6 contracts with pharmaceutical manufacturers. Pharmacy benefit 7 managers also perform utilization reviews, manage clinical programs targeted to specific disease states, and operate 8 9 pharmacies, including mail order and specialty pharmacies. 10 the past decade, the role of pharmacy benefit managers in the 11 delivery of health care has increased due to a variety of 12 factors, including coverage expansions under the medicare Part D 13 prescription drug benefit and the federal Affordable Care Act 14 and an increase in prescription drug spending that has motivated 15 commercial health plans and self-insured employers to outsource 16 the management of their spending on outpatient prescription **17** drugs.

1 The legislature further finds that the actions of pharmacy 2 benefit managers can have wide-ranging impacts on pharmacies and 3 consumers in Hawaii, particularly on consumers in rural areas 4 who may have limited access to pharmacies within a pharmacy 5 benefit manager's network and local independent pharmacies. 6 Despite these potential impacts, pharmacy benefit managers are 7 not currently required to be registered. The legislature additionally finds that increased transparency is needed 8 9 regarding many aspects of pharmacy benefit management, including 10 pharmacy benefit managers' relationships with pharmaceutical 11 companies, formulary creation, and evidence of rebates provided 12 to health plans in the State. Finally, the legislature notes that prescription drugs are 13 14 a major factor of the spiraling increase in health care costs, 15 of which pharmacy benefit managers are a contributing factor. 16 Giving clear authority to the insurance commissioner to regulate 17 pharmacy benefit managers is therefore an important first step 18 toward regulating this industry and is necessary to provide

transparency and ensure adequate consumer protection.

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1	(2) A health program administered by the State in the
2	capacity of a provider of health coverage; or
3	(3) An employer, labor union, or other group of persons
4	organized in the State that provides health coverage
5	to covered persons employed or residing in the State.
6	"Covered entity" shall not include any plans issued for coverage
7	for federal employees or specified disease or limited benefit
8	health insurance as provided by section 431:10A-102.5.
9	"Covered person" means a member, policyholder, subscriber,
10	enrollee, beneficiary, dependent, or other individual
11	participating in a prescription drug benefit plan.
12	"Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation,
13	organization, or other business entity.
14	"Pharmacy benefit management" means:
15	(1) Any of the following services provided with regard to
16	the administration of pharmacy benefits:
17	(A) Mail service pharmacy;
18	(B) Claims processing, retail network management, and
19	payment of claims to pharmacies for prescription
20	drugs dispensed to covered persons;

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1		(C)	Clinical formulary development and management
2			services;
3		(D)	Rebate contracting and administration;
4		(E)	Certain patient compliance, therapeutic
5			intervention, and generic substitution programs;
6			or
7		(F)	Disease management programs involving
8			prescription drug utilization;
9	(2)	The	procurement of prescription drugs by a pharmacy
10		bene	fit manager at a negotiated rate for dispensation
11		to c	overed persons in the State; or
12	(3)	The	administration or management of prescription drug
13		bene	fits provided by a covered entity for the benefit
14		of c	overed persons.
15	"Pha	rmacy	benefit manager" means any person that performs
16	pharmacy :	benef	it management, including but not limited to a
17	person or	enti	ty in a contractual or employment relationship
18	with a ph	armac	y benefit manager to perform pharmacy benefit
19	managemen	t for	a covered entity.

1	"Prescription drug benefit plan" means a health insurance
2	plan offered by a covered entity that includes coverage for
3	prescription drugs.
4	§ -B Applicability. This chapter shall apply to any
5	pharmacy benefit manager that provides pharmacy benefit
6	management services to covered persons who are residents of the
7	State.
8	§ -C Registration required. (a) Notwithstanding any
9	law to the contrary, no person shall act or operate as a
10	pharmacy benefit manager without first obtaining a valid
11	registration issued by the commissioner pursuant to this
12	chapter.
13	(b) Each person seeking to register as a pharmacy benefit
14	manager shall file with the commissioner an application on a
15	form prescribed by the commissioner. The application shall
16	include:
17	(1) The name, address, official position, and professional
18	qualifications of each individual who is responsible
19	for the conduct of the affairs of the pharmacy benefit

manager, including all members of the board of

directors; board of trustees; executive commission;

1	other governing board or committee; principal
2	officers, as applicable; partners or members, as
3	applicable; and any other person who exercises control
4	or influence over the affairs of the pharmacy benefit
5	manager;
6	(2) The name and address of the applicant's agent for
7	service of process in the State; and
8	(3) A nonrefundable application fee of \$140.
9	S -D Annual renewal requirement. (a) Each pharmacy
10	benefit manager shall renew its registration by March 31 each
11	year.
12	(b) When renewing its registration, a pharmacy benefit
13	manager shall submit to the commissioner the following:
14	(1) An application for renewal on a form prescribed by the
15	commissioner; and
16	(2) A renewal fee of \$140.
17	(c) Failure on the part of a pharmacy benefit manager to
18	renew its registration as provided in this section shall result
19	in a penalty of \$140 and may cause the registration to be
20	revoked or suspended by the commissioner until the requirements
21	for renewal have been met.
