A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A YOUTH ADVISORY COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that increasing youth
- 2 participation in the public policymaking process is a vital
- 3 state interest because Hawaii has the lowest youth voter
- 4 participation rate in the United States. In 2008, Hawaii had
- 5 the lowest voter participation rate among eighteen to twenty-
- 6 nine year olds in the country, at thirty-one per cent, compared
- 7 to fifty-seven per cent voter participation among those thirty
- 8 years of age and older.
- 9 The legislature further finds that young people aged
- 10 sixteen and seventeen may work, pay taxes, marry, and drive.
- 11 However, they are denied a formal role in the political process
- 12 because they are prohibited from voting. Because young people
- 13 under the age of eighteen may not vote, they deserve access and
- 14 input through other means to the policymaking process.
- 15 Many of the most persistent issues facing the State, such
- 16 as affordable housing, jobs, and education, primarily affect
- 17 young people. Young people are the ones who need a place to

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- 1 live, depend on good employment to support themselves and their
- 2 families, and seek quality education for their children. Yet
- 3 after many decades, these issues remain among the most difficult
- 4 to address.
- 5 The legislature further finds that a youth advisory
- 6 commission would enable a greater role for young people in the
- 7 policymaking process. Furthermore, the legislature and governor
- 8 would benefit from additional formal input from young people on
- 9 the effect of legislation on young people in the State.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 11 (1) Establish a youth advisory commission within the
- office of youth services to advise the governor and
- 13 legislature on the effects of legislative policies,
- needs, assessments, priorities, programs, and budgets
- concerning the youth of the State; and
- 16 (2) Appropriate funds for the hiring of one staff position
- 17 to administer the youth advisory commission and other
- 18 administration costs.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 352D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 21 and to read as follows:

1	" <u>§35</u>	2D- Youth advisory commission. (a) There is									
2	established within the office of youth services, for										
3	administrative purposes only, a youth advisory commission to										
4	advise the governor and legislature on the effects of										
5	legislative policies, needs, assessments, priorities, programs,										
6	and budgets concerning the youth of the State. The commission										
7	shall respond to requests for comment and recommendation on										
8	matters referred to it by the governor or legislature.										
9	(b)	The youth advisory commission shall consist of fifteer									
10	members b	etween the ages of fourteen and twenty-four, of whom:									
11	(1)	Five members shall be appointed by the governor;									
12		provided that the governor shall ensure that each									
13		county is represented by at least one appointment;									
14		provided further that the governor shall ensure that									
15		at least one member is a previous recipient of youth									
16		services;									
17	(2)	Five members shall be appointed by the president of									
18		the senate; and									
19	(3)	Five members shall be appointed by the speaker of the									
20	<u> </u>	house of representatives;

- 3 a diverse cross section of race, color, religion, creed, sex,
- 4 <u>sexual orientation</u>, gender identity, national origin, ancestry,
- 5 age, veteran status, disability, genetic information, and
- 6 military service when making their appointments.
- 7 (c) Each member shall be appointed for a term of two
- 8 years; provided that the initial terms of the appointed members
- 9 shall be staggered as follows:
- 10 <u>(1)</u> Six members, two each appointed by the governor, the

 11 president of the senate, and the speaker of the house,

 12 to serve three-year terms;
- 13 (2) Six members, two each appointed by the governor, the

 14 president of the senate, and the speaker of the house,

 15 to serve two-year terms; and
- 16 (3) Three members, one each appointed by the governor, the

 17 president of the senate, and the speaker of the house,

 18 to serve one-year terms.
- 19 (d) The members of the youth advisory commission shall not 20 be subject to section 26-34.

- 1 (e) The youth advisory commission shall annually elect a
- 2 chairperson.
- 3 (f) Eight members of the youth advisory commission shall
- 4 constitute a quorum to do business. Any action taken by the
- 5 commission shall be validated by a simple majority of the
- 6 quorum.
- 7 (g) The youth advisory commission members may invite other
- 8 individuals to participate in commission activities as
- 9 temporary, nonvoting members."
- 10 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 13 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 14 year 2018-2019 for the hiring of one staff position to
- 15 administer the youth advisory commission and other associated
- 16 administrative costs.
- 17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 18 youth services for the purposes of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
