A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that S.C.R. No. 74, S.D. 2 1, regular session of 2014, requested the office of the auditor 3 to conduct an audit of the department of health's advance disposal fee program. In response, the office of the auditor 4 5 released Report No. 14-17 in December of 2014, which recommended 6 that the department of health: 7 (1)Consider combining the advance disposal fee and 8 deposit beverage container glass processing streams to 9 increase efficiency and decrease costs while 10 increasing the supply of glass available for down-11 cycling; 12 Update and finalize the 2008 department of health (2) 13 policy glass recycling draft dated July 1, 2008, to: 14 Equally allow recycling or down-cycling; (A) 15 (B) Clearly allow stockpiling of glass for the 16 purposes of maintaining inventory;
