

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 346-222, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 4 and to read: 5 ""Physical isolation" means denial of the ability and means 6 to communicate, visit, or interact with family, friends, and 7 care providers at reasonable times and on a reasonable number of 8 days." 9 By amending the definition of "abuse" to read: 10 ""Abuse" means any of the following, separately or in 11 combination: 12 (1) Physical abuse; 13 (2) Physical isolation; 14 (3) Psychological abuse; 15  $\left[\frac{3}{3}\right]$  (4) Sexual abuse; 16  $[\frac{4}{1}]$  (5) Financial exploitation; **17**  $[\frac{(5)}{(5)}]$  (6) Caregiver neglect; or

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1  $[\frac{(6)}{(7)}]$  (7) Self-neglect  $[\frac{1}{7}]$ , 2 each as further defined in this chapter. Abuse does not 3 include, and a determination of abuse shall not be based solely 4 on, physical, psychological, or financial conditions that result 5 when a vulnerable adult seeks, or when a caregiver provides or 6 permits to be provided, treatment with the express consent of 7 the vulnerable adult or in accordance with the vulnerable 8 adult's religious or spiritual practices." 9 3. By amending the definition of "caregiver neglect" to **10** read: 11 ""Caregiver neglect" means the failure of a caregiver to 12 exercise that degree of care for a vulnerable adult that a **13** reasonable person with the responsibility of a caregiver would 14 exercise within the scope of the caregiver's assumed, legal or contractual duties, including but not limited to the failure to: **15** 16 Assist with personal hygiene; (1) 17 (2) Protect the vulnerable adult from abandonment; 18 Provide, in a timely manner, necessary food, shelter, (3) 19 or clothing;

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1	(4)	Provide, in a timely manner, necessary health care,
2		access to health care, prescribed medication,
3		psychological care, physical care, or supervision;
4	(5)	Protect the vulnerable adult from dangerous, harmful,
5		or detrimental drugs, as defined in section 712-1240;
6		provided that this paragraph shall not apply to drugs
7		that are provided to the vulnerable adult pursuant to
8		the direction or prescription of a practitioner, as
9		defined in section 712-1240;
10	(6)	Protect the vulnerable adult from health and safety
11		hazards; [ <del>or</del> ]
12	(7)	Protect the vulnerable adult from abuse by third
13		parties[-]; or
14	(8)	Permit the vulnerable adult to communicate, receive
15		visits, or interact with family, friends, and care
16		providers at reasonable times and on a reasonable
17		number of days."
18	4.	By amending the definition of "psychological abuse" to
19	read:	
20	""Ps	ychological abuse" means the infliction of mental or

emotional distress by use of threats, insults, harassment,

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- humiliation, provocation, intimidation, physical isolation, or 1
- other means that profoundly confuse or frighten a vulnerable 2
- 3 adult."
- 4 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 6
