RELATING TO CANDIDATE COMMITTEE REPORTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1	. Section 11-334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by ame	nding subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:

The report shall be 13 current through the day of the applicable election [-]; 14 and 15 (3) The filing date for the final election period report 16 is thirty calendar days after a general, subsequent, 17 subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan 18 election. The report shall be current through the day 19 of the applicable election. The final election period 20 report shall be filed by a candidate who is 21 unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or initial
