

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that homelessness
- 2 continues to be one of the State's most significant and
- 3 challenging social problems. According to the 2016 Hawaii
- 4 Statewide Homeless Point-In-Time conducted in January 2016,
- 5 there are 7,921 homeless individuals in the State, an overall
- 6 increase of four per cent from 2015. Homelessness is a complex
- 7 issue that requires continuous resources and coordinated efforts
- 8 at all levels, including improving access to information of
- 9 homeless individuals who are served by service providers.
- 10 Oftentimes, critical services are delayed for homeless
- 11 individuals because of the difficulties in accessing pertinent
- 12 records and information.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to study
- 14 the impact and feasibility of creating an integrated database
- 15 with certain records of homeless individuals for providers of
- 16 homeless services to track services and optimize costs.

- 1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
- thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the 3
- 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 5 2018-2019 for the department of human services to conduct a
- 6 study on the impact and feasibility of creating an integrated
- database for providers of homeless services that provides access 7
- 8 to certain information about homeless individuals served,
- 9 including police, medical, social services, and mental health
- 10 records, to improve tracking services provided and optimize
- 11 costs.
- 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 13 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
