A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that requiring all high school graduates to have a basic understanding of United States civics and history will promote and encourage active and engaged citizenship.

 The purpose of this Act is to require that all high school students pass the basic civics test produced by the United

 States Citizenship and Immigration Services.

- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
- 10 designated and to read as follows:
- 11 "§302A- Civics education. (a) The department shall
- 12 <u>establish and maintain a civics education course to be taught at</u>
- each public high school in the State. The course content shall
- 14 prepare students to take, and pass, the United States
- 15 citizenship civics test, produced by the United States
- 16 Citizenship and Immigration Services.

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1	(b) As a part of the requirements necessary for a student
2	to complete to qualify for graduation, every student, beginning
3	with students entering the ninth grade in the 2017-2018 school
4	year, shall be required to pass a test substantially equivalent
5	to the United States citizenship civics test, produced by the
6	United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, prior to the
7	student's graduation from high school. No entity shall place a
8	limit on the number of times a student may take the test.
9	As used in this section:
10	"Pass" means achieve a score of not less than sixty per
11	cent of the maximum score.
12	"United States citizenship civics test, produced by the
13	United States Citizenship and Immigration Services" means the
14	one hundred question test used by the United States Citizenship
15	and Immigration Services and administered to all applicants for
16	United States citizenship.
17	§302A- General educational development; civics knowledge
18	required. Starting January 1, 2018, no person shall be allowed
19	to take the general educational development test without first
20	achieving at least sixty per cent of the maximum score of the
21	one hundred question test used by the United States Citizenship
