A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that most of the State's
- 2 correctional facilities are extremely old, are in need of
- 3 significant repair and maintenance, and lack the capacity to
- 4 accommodate current and projected detention needs.
- 5 The Waiawa correctional facility is a minimum-security
- 6 facility that houses about three hundred thirty adult male
- 7 sentenced felons who participate in educational programs and
- 8 community worklines.
- 9 The Halawa correctional facility consists of two separate
- 10 facilities. The special-needs facility houses about one hundred
- 11 maximum- and closed-custody inmates, inmates with severe or
- 12 chronic mental illness who cannot be placed in the general
- 13 population, and inmates who require protective custody. The
- 14 medium-security prison facility houses approximately one
- 15 thousand two hundred male sentenced felons.
- 16 To mitigate prison overcrowding, there are about one
- 17 thousand four hundred male inmates from Halawa correctional

- 1 facility who are housed in a contracted facility in Arizona at a
- 2 cost of more than \$40,000,000 annually.
- 3 The Oahu community correctional center is the largest jail
- 4 facility in the State, housing about one thousand two hundred
- 5 pre-trial detainees, short-term sentenced individuals, probation
- 6 and parole violators, and a pre-release work furlough center.
- 7 The legislature further finds that the Waiawa correctional
- 8 facility is located on one hundred ninety-seven acres in central
- 9 Oahu with ample land area for a new, higher-capacity
- 10 correctional facility that could house additional inmates from
- 11 Halawa correctional facility and house Hawaii inmates from the
- 12 contracted facility in Arizona. This in turn would enable the
- 13 relocation of the Oahu community correctional center to a
- 14 renovated Halawa correctional facility.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 16 (1) Require the department of public safety to solicit
- 17 proposals for the purchase or construction of a three
- 18 thousand-bed correctional facility at the site of the
- 19 Waiawa correctional facility. The new facility shall
- 20 be capable of housing the current inmate population of
- 21 the Halawa correctional facility, Hawaii inmates now

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1	housed in Arizona, and the inmate population of
2	existing Waiawa correctional facility; and
3	(2) Upon completion of the new correctional facility at
4	the site of the Waiawa correctional facility, relocate
5	the operations of the Oahu community correctional
6	center to the vacated site of the Halawa correctional
7	facility.
8	SECTION 2. (a) The department of public safety shall
9	solicit proposals for the purchase or construction of a three
10	thousand-bed correctional facility at the site of the Waiawa
11	correctional facility that would be capable of housing the
12	current inmate populations of the Halawa correctional facility,
13	Hawaii inmates now housed in Arizona, and the inmate population
14	of the existing Waiawa correctional facility.
15	(b) Upon completion of the new correctional facility at
16	the site of the Waiawa correctional facility, the department of
17	public safety shall relocate the operations of the Oahu
18	community correctional center to the vacated site of the Halawa
19	correctional facility.
20	(c) The new facility shall:
21	(1) Be operated by public employees;

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1	(2)	Provide a range of custody levels, including community
2		custody, minimum-security, and maximum-security;
3	(3)	Be designed to appropriately house inmates in units
4		reflecting their custody levels; and
5	(4)	Include opportunities for counseling, vocational
6		training, and education for inmates.
7	SECT	ION 3. The department of public safety may enter into:
8	(1)	A public-private partnership to plan, design, and
9		construct the new correctional facility at the site of
10		the Waiawa correctional facility; and
11	(2)	A lease-option contract with any private owner of the
12		new correctional facility at the site of the Waiawa
13		correctional facility to rent the facility for a set
14		amount of time before exercising the option to
15		purchase the facility when or before the lease
16		expires.
17	SECT	ION 4. The director of public safety shall submit a
18	report to	the legislature at least twenty days prior to the
19	convening	of the regular session of 2018, of the director's
20	findings	and recommendations, including:

1	(1)	A list of proposals with total costs for the purchase
2		or construction of a three thousand-bed correctional
3		facility at the site of the Waiawa correctional
4		facility in accordance with this Act;
5	(2)	The feasibility of:
6		(A) Relocating the operations of the Oahu community
7		correctional center to the vacated site of the
8		Halawa correctional facility;
9		(B) Entering into a public-private partnership to
10		plan, design, and construct the new correctional
11		facility at the site of the Waiawa correctional
12		facility; and
13		(C) Entering into a lease-option contract with any
14		private owner of the new correctional facility at
15		the site of the Waiawa correctional facility to
16		rent the facility for a set amount of time before
17		exercising the option to purchase the facility
18		when or before the lease expires; and
19	(3)	Any proposed legislation, any funding requests, and
20		any other relevant information that the director of
21		public safety deems necessary to implement this Act.

1	SECT	ION 5. The department of public safety shall suspend
2	the curre	nt environmental impact statement process for its short
3	list of f	our potential sites for the proposed Oahu community
4	correctio	nal center until the department of public safety:
5	(1)	Considers alternative sites of 4.5 acres in size or
6		larger and provides a list of alternative sites and
7		the reasons for adding or omitting the alternative
8		sites from consideration as potential sites for the
9		proposed Oahu community correctional center;
10	(2)	Consults with the task force created by house
11		concurrent resolution no. 85 (2016) and the
12		corrections population management commission about the
13		appropriate capacity and design of the proposed Oahu
14		community correctional center in view of changes to
15		the criminal justice system in areas of pre-trial
16		diversion programs, expansion of Hawaii's Opportunity
17		Probation with Enforcement (HOPE) program and other
18		probation programs, expansion of work furlough, and
19		the use of other alternatives to incarceration
20		programs; and

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1	(3) Provides a report with respect to paragraphs (1) and
2	(2) to the legislature no less than twenty days prior
3	to the convening of the regular session of 2018.
4	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2099.
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Report Title:

Waiawa Correctional Facility; Halawa Correctional Facility; Oahu Community Correctional Center

Description:

Requires the Department of Public Safety to solicit proposals for a new correctional facility at Waiawa Correctional Facility. Requires new facility to be operated by public employees. Suspends the current EIS process for potential sites for the proposed Oahu Community Correctional Center.

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
