A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE REPEAL OF SECTION 325-15, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that mandatory testing
- 2 for tuberculosis of United States citizens returning from
- 3 certain areas after absences of five or more years provides
- 4 marginal benefits to tuberculosis control in Hawaii and is
- 5 costly to maintain and impractical to enforce. Repealing this
- 6 requirement will diminish burdens for travelers without
- 7 significant risk to public health.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to repeal section 325-15, Hawaii
- 9 Revised Statutes, which requires United States citizens or
- 10 nationals upon returning to the State after five or more years'
- 11 residence in any United States territory or possession, or any
- 12 foreign country, with a high occurrence of infectious and
- 13 communicable diseases, to submit a medical examination report
- 14 that shall include a tuberculin skin test or a chest x-ray
- 15 examination, and in the case of a positive skin test, a chest

- 1 x-ray report, to the department of health within sixty days of
- 2 returning to the State.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 325-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 repealed.
- 5 ["[\$325-15] Infectious and communicable diseases,
- 6 examination and treatment. United States citizens or nationals,
- 7 upon returning to this State after five or more years residence
- 8 in any territory or possession of the United States, or any
- 9 foreign country, with a high occurrence of infectious and
- 10 communicable diseases, shall submit a medical examination report
- 11 that shall include a tuberculin skin test or a chest x-ray
- 12 examination, and in the case of a positive skin test a chest x
- 13 ray report shall be submitted, to the department of health
- 14 within sixty days of return to this State. The department of
- 15 health shall cooperate with public and private authorities,
- 16 where feasible, in implementing this section."]
- 17 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
